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Banking & Finance

1. Karnataka Bank raises Rs 600 cr through qualified institutional placement

Karnataka Bank said it has raised around Rs 600 crore through qualified institutional placement by issuing shares to institutional investors.

• The qualified institutional placement opened on March 21 and closed on March 27. The institutions which bought shares in the QIP include HSBC Mutual Fund, Morgan Stanley Asia Singapore PTE, HSBC Global Investment Funds, SBI Life etc.

2. Canara Bank launches loans for healthcare, savings accounts for women

• Canara Bank on 3 April, launched healthcare focused loan product Canara Heal, which will meet the shortfall in hospitalization expenditure while settling through TPA healthcare insurance claims of self and/or dependents. Bank also launched a customized savings account for women ' Canara Angel ' with unique features like Cancer Care policy.

• It also launched pre-approved personal loan Canara ReadyCash and an Online Loan against term deposit product Canara MyMoney.

• <u>Canara bank exchanged Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with both</u> <u>MediAssist Healthcare Services Ltd and Bajaj Allianz General Insurance Company Ltd. for</u> <u>enhancing healthcare accessibility and affordability of product for its customers.</u>

3. RBI defers implementing rules on exchange-traded forex derivatives to May 3

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) deferred the implementation of norms on exchange-traded</u> currency derivatives (ETCDs) linked to Indian rupee until May 3 following concerns by investors.

• The norms were scheduled to <u>take effect starting 5 April.</u> Now, rupee-denominated currency contracts traded on the National Stock Exchange (NSE) and the BSE require underlying exposure.

• Though traders are not required to provide evidence of underlying exposure for positions up to \$100 million , they must confirm the existence of such exposure.

• As hitherto, participants with a valid underlying contracted exposure can continue to enter into ETCDs involving the <u>rupee up to a limit of \$100 million</u> without having to produce documentary evidence of the underlying exposure.

As per RBI the regulatory framework for participation in ETCDs involving the rupee is guided by the
provisions of the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999, and regulations framed thereunder, which
mandate that currency derivative contracts involving rupee "both over-the-counter and exchange traded
"are permitted only for the purpose of hedging of exposure to foreign exchange

4. Bandhan Mutual Fund announces launch of the Bandhan Innovation Fund

• Bandhan Mutual Fund (MF) announced the launch of the **Bandhan Innovation Fund.** The scheme will open for subscription on April 10 and will invest in companies with substantial R&D investment, high skilled-employee costs, potentially higher margins or growth, unique products or services, non-linear business models, and a notable brand presence.

 "The fund will allocate its investments across a spectrum of innovators: 35-45 per cent to leading innovators with substantial industry R&D investments; 35-45 per cent to rising innovators utilising

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innovation for a competitive edge; and 10-15 per cent to emerging innovators," the fund house said in a release.

5. RBI Projects Consumer Price Index Inflation For This Fiscal At 4.5%

<u>Shaktikanta Das announced the Bi-Monthly Monetary policy said the Monetary Policy</u>
 <u>Committee (MPC) has decided to keep the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent. Consequently,</u>
 <u>the Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate remains at 6.25 per cent and the Marginal Standing</u>
 <u>Facility (MSF) Rate and the Bank Rate at 6.75 per cent.</u>

• The Governor said, real GDP growth for 2024-25 is projected at <u>7.0 per cent with Quarter 1 at 7.1</u> per cent; Quarter 2 at 6.9 per cent; Quarter 3 at 7.0 per cent; and Quarter 4 also at 7.0 per cent.

• <u>CPI inflation for 2024-25 is projected at 4.5 per cent</u>. Mr. Das said, that two years ago, around this time, <u>CPI inflation had peaked at 7.8 per cent in April 2022.</u>

6. RBI proposes to make CBDC-R accessible to non-bank payments system operators

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) proposed to make Central Bank Digital Currency-Retail</u> (CBDC-R) accessible to a broader population by allowing non-bank payment system operators to offer CBDC wallets.

• Non-bank payment system operators include third-party payment applications like PhonePe, Google Pay, etc.

CBDC programme: -

- The RBI launched the CBDC pilot programme in 2022. The Indian CBDC, also known as digital rupee, is a tokenised digital version of the rupee issued by the RBI.
- The main objective is to mitigate the risks and trim costs in handling physical currency, costs of
 phasing out soiled notes, transportation, insurance and logistics.

7. RBI projects GDP growth at 7%, inflation at 4.5% for FY 2024-2025

While announcing the bi- monthly monetary policy, the Reserve Bank of India has said, the Consumer Price Index inflation for 2024- 25 is projected at 4.5 per cent.


• The real GDP growth for 2024-25 is projected at <u>7.0 percent with Quarter 1</u> at <u>7.1 percent; Quarter 2 at</u> <u>6.9 percent; Quarter 3 at 7.0 percent; and Quarter 4 also at 7.0 percent.</u>

• Consumer Price Index (CPI) is one of the price indices used to measure the change in the retail prices of goods and services consumed by a defined population group in a given area.

• The National Statistical Office (NSO), under the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation compiles CPI separately for rural, urban, and combined sectors on a monthly basis.

8. Consumer confidence for year ahead improves further: RBI survey

• <u>Consumer confidence for the year ahead has improved further on the back of higher optimism, which resulted in the Future Expectations Index (FEI) rising by **2.1 points to 125.2**, the highest level since mid-2019, according to a Reserve Bank of India survey conducted in March 2024.</u>







• Households' sentiments on the general economic situation and employment prospects recorded notable improvements for both the current period as well as the upcoming year. The Reserve Bank released the results of the March 2024 round of its bi-monthly Consumer Confidence Survey (CCS) along with the monetary policy review. Female respondents accounted for 50.8%

• The RBI in a statement said the survey collects current perceptions and one-year-ahead expectations of households on general economic situation, employment scenario, overall price situation, own income and spending across **19 major cities**. The latest round of the survey was conducted during March 2-11, 2024, **covering 6,083 respondents**.

9. RBI penalises IDFC First Bank, LIC Housing Finance for non-compliance

• <u>RBI has imposed a penalty of Rs. 1 crore on IDFC First Bank for non-compliance with certain directions on 'Loans and Advances ' Statutory and Other Restrictions'. The Statutory Inspection for Supervisory Evaluation for FY22 revealed that the bank had sanctioned term loans to a public sector undertaking for financing infrastructure projects without undertaking due diligence.</u>

• **The central bank also fined LIC Housing Finance Rs. 49.7 lakh for breach of norms.** The housing finance company did not comply with certain provisions of the Fair Practices Code when it did not disclose the rate of interest and approach for gradation of risk and rationale for charging different rate of interest to different categories of borrowers in loan application forms.

10. RBI cancels four NBFCs' certificate of registration

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on April 5 said it has cancelled certificate of registration of four nonbanking finance companies (NBFCs). These NBFCs are Kundles Motor Finance Pvt Ltd, Nithya Finance Ltd, Bhatia Hire Purchase Pvt Ltd, and Jiwanjyoti Deposits and Advances Limited,

• In a separate notification, the central bank said five NBFCs have surrendered their licences due to exit from NBFC business. These NBFCs are Growing Opportunity Finance (India) Pvt Ltd, Invel Commercial Pvt. Ltd, Mohan Finance Ltd, Saraswati Properties Ltd, and Quicker Marketing Pvt Ltd, release said.

11. Union Bank raises Rs 42,000 cr from DIFC to fund overseas business growth

<u>State-owned Union Bank of India said it has raised \$500 million (about Rs 4,200 crore)</u>
 <u>from foreign markets to fund overseas business growth.</u> The fund was arranged by Dubai
 International Financial Centre, Dubai Branch, Union Bank of India said in a regulatory filing. A
 <u>syndicated term loan of \$ 500 million would be drawn in two tranches with tenure of 3 and 5</u>
 <u>years.</u>

12. Private equity firm Bain Capital to sell remaining Axis Bank holding

 Private equity firm Bain Capital will offload its remaining 1.08 per cent stake (33.37 million shares) in Axis Bank. The price range for the share sale has been set at Rs 1,071 - Rs 1,076 per share, a discount of up to 0.47 per cent to Axis Bank's last close of Rs 1,076 per share. BofA Securities India is the sole investment bank handling the transaction.

13. SBI, Standard Chartered do a CDS trade under new RBI norms

 <u>Marking the first such transaction after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued fresh</u> <u>guidelines for the instrument, State Bank of India and Standard Chartered Bank India carried</u> <u>out a Credit Default Swap (CDS) trade worth Rs. 25 crore. The trade involved a 1-year rupee</u> <u>CDS featuring REC.</u>





• Credit default swaps are derivative instruments that provide a form of insurance against the risk of default of the issuer of a bond.

14. HDFC becomes first private bank to open branch in Lakshadweep

• HDFC Bank opened a branch at Kavaratti Island in Lakshadweep, making it the only private sector bank to have a branch in the Union Territory. HDFC Bank has branches in the cold climes of Kashmir, the southern tip of Kanyakumari and now the island of Lakshadweep - a prominent tourist place. As of December 31, 2023, the HDFC Bank's distribution network was at 8,091 branches.

15. PSU banks beat private peers in market capitalisation gains during Q4

• <u>State-owned banks beat their private-sector peers, posting the highest gains in their</u> <u>market capitalisation in Q4 FY24, on the back of improved financial metrics. The government's</u> <u>focus on long-term projects also largely benefits state-owned lenders, S&P Market Intelligence</u> <u>said in a note.</u>

• <u>15 of the 20 largest banks in India logged gains in market capitalisation, with 13 of</u> <u>them posting double-digit increases.</u> Market capitalisation of all PSU banks, on the list of the country's 20 largest banks, improved from the previous quarter. <u>Indian Overseas Bank led the</u> <u>country's 20 largest banks with a 38.5% sequential increase in market cap to Rs. 1.13-lakh</u> <u>crore.</u>

• Punjab & Sind Bank and Bank of Maharashtra ranked second and third, with gains of 38.4 per cent and 38.1 per cent, respectively. On the other hand, only ICICI Bank and Yes Bank saw an improvement among private banks, posting single digit growth in market capitalisation.

16. RBI rejects two applications for small finance bank

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has rejected two more applications, including that of</u> <u>Dvara Kshetriya Gramin Financial Services, for setting up small finance banks. Earlier in July</u> <u>2023, it had rejected three applications. RBI had received about a dozen applications to set up</u> <u>banks under the guidelines for 'on tap' Licensing of Universal Banks and Small Finance Banks</u> (SFBs).

• The guidelines for 'on tap' licensing of Universal Banks and SFBs in the private sector were issued on August 1, 2016, and December 5, 2019, respectively. In a statement, the RBI said the examination of two more applications for setting up a small finance bank has been completed as per the procedure laid down under extant guidelines.

17. Revolut gets RBI nod to issue Prepaid Payment Instruments in India

• <u>Revolut India on 12 April said that it has received an in-principal authorization from the</u> <u>Reserve Bank of India to issue Prepaid Payment Instruments (PPI) including prepaid cards and</u> <u>prepaid wallets in the country.</u> Revolut, a London-based neobank and financial technology company, has been gearing up for its entry into India, working closely with the RBI over the past 2 years.

• This approval builds upon the existing licences which Revolut India has successfully obtained from RBI to operate as a Category-II Authorised Money Exchange Dealer (AD II) and to be able to provide multi-currency forex cards and cross-border remittance services.

18. Japan-based MUFG to acquire 20% stake in HDFC Bank's non-banking arm at close \$10 bn valuation

• <u>The Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ (MUFG) is getting ready to acquire a 20 per cent stake in</u> <u>HDB Financial Services, a non-banking subsidiary of HDFC Bank, at a valuation of \$9-10 billion.</u> HDFC Bank, the country's largest private lender, currently owns around 95 per cent of HDB Financial





Services, with the remaining 5% held by employees under an Employee Stock Ownership plan.

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19. CAMS gets RBI's nod to operate as an online payment aggregator

• <u>Computer Age Management Services Ltd said the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted</u> <u>authorisation</u> to the company to operate as an online payment aggregator. It has received it after the business became regulated consequent to the issue of 'Guidelines on Regulation of Payment Aggregators and Payment Gateways' (Guidelines) in March 2020.

20. Bank of India signs pact with IMGC for mortgage guarantee on home loans

• Public sector lender Bank of India and Indian Mortgage Guarantee Corporation have signed a pact to provide mortgage guarantee-backed home loan products in the affordable housing segment. It will cover salaried and self-employed home loan customers. IMGC will mitigate the risk of defaults for the bank, allowing it to potentially offer more favourable loan term to borrowers.

21. UCB advances to priority sector up over 27% in FY23, shows RBI data

• <u>The advances of Urban Co-operative Banks (UCBs) to the priority sector surged more than 27</u> per cent in the financial year 2023, compared to the previous year, the Reserve Bank of India's annual 'Primary (Urban) Co-operative Banks' Outlook 2022-23' showed.

• The RBI report put the advances for UCBs in FY23 at Rs 2.2 trillion, up from Rs 1.73 trillion in FY22.

• <u>A majority of the advances of UCBs was given to MSMEs (micro, small & medium enterprises),</u> amounting to Rs 1.3 trillion in FY23 against Rs 1 trillion in FY22.

• Of the total lending by UCBs to the priority sector, almost 40 per cent was to the MSMEs in FY23 compared to 34.27 per cent last year. Within MSMEs, micro enterprises had the highest share at 17.23 per cent.

22. India's outward FDI rises to \$3.91 billion in March, shows RBI data

India's outward foreign direct investment commitments rose significantly to \$3.91 billion in
 March 2024, compared to \$2.63 billion in March 2023. Sequentially, they were also higher than
 \$3.67 billion in February 2024, according to Reserve Bank of India data. Outbound FDI, expressed as a financial commitment, comprises three components: equity, loans, and guarantees.

23. RBI issues draft norms for offline payment aggregators, moots '15-cr net worth

<u>The Reserve Bank of India has issued two draft directions on regulation of Payment</u>
 <u>Aggregators (PA), pertaining to physical Point-of-Sale (PoS) activities of these players, net</u>
 <u>worth and licensing requirements. The payments ecosystem in India includes online PAs (PA - O) and those which facilitate face-to-face or proximity payment transactions ((PA - P).</u>

• The draft guidelines mandate PA-P banks to comply with the final norms within three months of issue whereas non-bank entities providing PA-P services will need to inform RBI about their intention to seek authorisation within 60 days of the circular being issued and submit an application by May 2025.

• Non-banks providing PA-P services will need a minimum net worth of Rs. 15 crores at the time of application and a minimum net worth of Rs. 25 crores by March 31, 2028. It also said that for face-to-face/proximity payment transactions done using cards, shall store the card-on-file data from August 1, 2025.

24. Fitch affirms 'BBB-' rating for SBI, Canara Bank; outlook stable

 <u>Fitch Ratings affirmed the long-term Issuer Default Rating (IDR) of both State Bank of</u> <u>India (SBI) and Canara Bank at 'BBB-' and said the outlook looks stable. Fitch has also affirmed</u> <u>SBI's</u>





<u>Viability Rating (VR) at 'BB' and Government Support Rating (GSR) of 'BBB'-. The PSU bank</u> stock was trading 1% lower at Rs 749.

• The IDR rating of BBB- denotes that the banks have adequate capacity for payment of financial commitments. Fitch has projected bright profitability prospects for both lenders.

25. RBI now allows gold hedging in overseas markets

 The RBI has decided to permit resident entities to hedge exposure to price risk of gold using OTC derivatives in the IFSC, in addition to the derivatives on exchanges in the IFSC. The banking regulator issued a circular on April 15 in this regard. This is to provide further flexibility to resident entities to hedge their exposures to the price risk of gold.

• Earlier, resident entities were permitted to hedge their exposure to the price risk of gold on exchanges in the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) recognised by the International Financial Services Centers Authority (IFSCA).

26. RBI to allow foreign investors in IFSC to invest in Sovereign Green Bonds

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced a move that's set to accelerate India's green</u> initiatives. Foreign investors operating within the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) can now invest in Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs). <u>India raised two tranches of sovereign green</u> <u>bonds amounting to Rs 16000 crore across two maturities in 2023.</u>

• Based on an announcement in the Union Budget for 2022-23, the government issued Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs) in January 2023. Subsequently, SGrBs were issued as part of the government borrowing calendar in 2023-24. These bonds, known as sovereign green bonds, are issued by the central bank to finance green initiatives.

27. RBI imposes Rs 60.3 lakh penalty on five co-operative banks

<u>The Reserve Bank has imposed penalties totaling Rs 60.3 lakh on five co-operative banks</u> for contravention of various regulatory norms.

• <u>A penalty of Rs 43.30 lakh has been imposed on Rajkot Nagarik Sahakari Bank for non-compliance</u> with <u>RBI directions on 'ban on loans and advances to directors and their relatives, and firms/concerns in</u> which they are interested'.

• <u>The central bank has imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 5 lakh each on The Kangra Co-operative</u> <u>Bank (New Delhi), Rajdhani Nagar Sahkari Bank (Lucknow), and Zila Sahakari Bank, Garhwal (Kotdwar,</u> <u>Uttarakhand). Besides, a penalty of Rs 2 has been imposed on District Co-operative Bank (Dehradun).</u>

28. RBI Policy Committee Flags Inflation Concerns; March Retail Inflation at 10-Month Low

- The majority of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) monetary policy committee members expressed caution on upside risks to inflation, particularly emanating from uncertainties in food prices, at the panel's policy review, showed the minutes of the meeting on April 19. In March, India's retail inflation eased to a ten-month low of 4.85 per cent, as against 5.09 per cent in February.
- This data was released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation on April 12.
- The inflation numbers were lowest since May 2023, when it was at 4.31 per cent.

• <u>The RBI projected CPI inflation for 2024-25 at 4.5 per cent with Q1 at 4.9 per cent; Q2 at 3.8 per cent; Q3 at 4.6 per cent; and Q4 at 4.5 per cent</u>.





29. Three Indian banks in top 50 banks in Asia-Pacific by assets

 Indian banks have been among the best-performing lenders among peers in Asia. Three Indian lenders made it to the list of top 50 banks by assets in the Asia-Pacific region in 2023, up from two in 2022. The aggregate assets of the lenders rose sharply by 50.5% y/y to \$1.51 trillion in 2023. The State Bank of India is at 20th position, HDFC Bank at 33 and ICICI Bank at 48.

• <u>The aggregate assets of the lenders rose sharply by 50.5% to \$1.510 trillion in 2023.</u> A large part of the increase was due to the merger of HDFC Bank Ltd. with its parent Housing Development Finance Corp. Ltd. in July 2022. <u>HDFC Bank's assets jumped 51.3% to \$466.35 billion after the merger, propelling the bank up 13 places to 33 in the top 50 ranking.</u>

30. Airtel Payments Bank Launches NCMC-Enabled Debit And Prepaid Cards

• <u>Airtel Payments Bank has announced the launch of its NCMC (National Common Mobility Cards) enabled debit and pre-paid cards in association with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). These cards are powered by RuPay.</u>

• <u>The bank said customers can use any of the cards to make payments at all merchant establishments,</u> online (e-commerce), as well as offline NCMC transit transactions at metros, buses, parking, etc across the country.

• The card also facilitates the issuance of concessions and monthly passes wherever supported by the transport operator.

31. CRED Secures In-Principle Approval For Payment Aggregator License

 Fintech firm Cred has received in-principal approval from the RBI for the payment aggregation (PA) business. Once it gets the final approval, the Peak XV-backed Bengaluru-based startup, which primarily runs a credit card bill payment platform for creditworthy customers, can double down on the merchant payments business too, joining the ranks of Razorpay and Cashfree.

• According to the RBI, Payment Aggregates (PAs) are entities that facilitate e-commerce sites and merchants' acceptance of various payment instruments from customers to complete their payment obligations without the need for merchants to create a separate payment integration system.

32. RBI declines Annapurna Finance's universal bank request

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India, in a cautious move, declined Annapurna Finance Limited's</u> application for a universal bank license made in January 2023. The regulator, expressing hesitation

about awarding a full-service bank license to the Odissa-based lender, largely focusing on microfinance loans, gave Annapurna Finance the option to become a small finance bank.

• UBs are financial entities like commercial banks, financial institutions, NBFCs, etc. that undertake multiple financial transactions. Any individual/entity with at least 10 years of experience in banking and finance at the senior level or private entities with 10 years of successful track record are eligible to apply for on-tap licensing as UBs.

• Secondly, aspiring entities ought to have assets of Rs. 5000 crore or above. Thirdly, the required net worth is Rs. 500 crore that has to be maintained at all times. However, large industrial houses are restricted to only invest in UBs up to 10% only. UBs and SFBs are subject to Banking Regulation Act, RBI Act, and all statutes as applicable to banking entities.





33. SBI Card introduces inaugural travel-centric core credit card 'MILES'

• SBI Card introduced its inaugural travel-centric core credit card, 'SBI Card MILES. The

card promises comprehensive travel benefits, including the conversion of Travel Credits to Air Miles and Hotel Points, enhanced rewards on all travel bookings, and access to airport lounges. <u>The bank has partnered with more than 20 leading airline and hotel brands.</u>

34. PayU gets RBI's in-principle approval to operate as payment aggregator

• Prosus-backed fintech PayU, received an in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to operate as a payment aggregator. In January last year, the banking regulator had asked the fintech company to reapply for a payment aggregator licence. The company's complex corporate structure was one reason why the RBI asked it to reapply for the licence.

35. RBI directs Kotak Mahindra Bank to cease issue of fresh credit cards, bars onboarding of new online customers

<u>The Reserve Bank of India has directed Kotak Mahindra Bank to cease issue of fresh credit cards, with immediate effect. The Apex Bank has restricted the onboarding of new customers via online and mobile banking channels. According to the RBI press release, these actions are necessitated based on significant concerns arising out of RBI's IT Examination for 2022 and 2023.</u>

• The continued failure on the part of the Bank to address these concerns in a comprehensive and timely manner. It added that for two consecutive years, the said bank was assessed to be deficient in its IT Risk and Information Security Governance, contrary to requirements under Regulatory guidelines.

• It said that during the subsequent assessments, the bank was found to be significantly non-compliant with the Corrective Action Plans issued by the Reserve Bank for the years 2022 and 2023, as the compliances submitted by the said Bank were found to be either inadequate, incorrect or not sustained.

36. RBI's compiled master direction on ARCs to be effective from April 24

- RBI released a master direction for asset reconstruction companies, saying the guidelines will be effective from April 24, 2024
- <u>ARCs are expected to have a minimum capital requirement of Rs 300 crore, compared to Rs 100 cr as of</u> <u>October 11, 2022. Existing ARCs have been provided a glide path to achieve the minimum required Net</u> <u>Owned Fund of Rs 300 cr as of March 31, 2026.</u>
- ARCs with a minimum NOF of Rs 1000 crore can act as resolution applicants.
- They are allowed to deploy funds in government securities and deposits with scheduled commercial banks, Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI), National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) or such other entities as may be specified by the central bank from time to time.

• ARCs can also invest in short-term instruments like money market mutual funds, certificates of deposit and corporate bonds/ commercial papers which have a short-term rating equivalent to the long-term rating of AA- or above by an eligible credit rating agency. <u>Investments will be subject to a cap of 10% of the NOF on maximum investment in such short-term instrument</u>.

37. RBI directs Talkcharge to stop PPI, wallet issuance; refund balances

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has directed fintech firm Talkcharge Technologies to stop</u> the issuance and operation of its Prepaid Payment Instruments (PPIs) or wallets, and refund the balances held in them to customers by May 17 this year.





• This has come after the central bank observed that the firm is issuing wallets without its permission.

• The RBI had directed the Gurugram-based firm to refund the prepaid amount lying in the wallets to the customers in an order dated April 2, 2024.

• The regulator also pointed out that the company had issued a legal notice to its customers demanding the return of cashback while threatening them that failure to do so would result in the matter being reported to the RBI.

38. Crisil's ESG ratings unit gets Sebi's approval for ESG scoring

• <u>The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has approved Crisil ESG Ratings &</u> <u>Analytics</u> <u>as a Category 1 provider of environmental, social, and governance (ESG) ratings. Crisil</u> <u>ESG</u> <u>Ratings, a unit of Crisil, was incorporated after Sebi amended the SEBI (Credit Rating</u> <u>Agencies)</u> <u>Regulations, 1999, to include provisions on ESG Rating Providers (ERPs) last year</u>.

• The rating provider launched its ESG scoring business in 2021 and now tracks over 1,000 companies across 65 sectors.

• The company said this business will now be transferred to the subsidiary Crisil ESG Ratings.

• ESG scores indicate a company's sustainability and ethical practices, guiding asset managers and investors in selecting companies that meet their ESG criteria.

• Sebi has established two rating entity categories based on their financial status and roles.

• The goal was to guarantee transparent, practical, accurate methodologies aligned with the Indian environment. As per Sebi, the accredited rating agency is required to publish its evaluation methodology for all ESG ratings on its official website.

• <u>Besides, the principal shareholder of an ESG rating agency is mandated to retain a minimum</u> ownership interest of 26% in said agency for at least five years subsequent to receiving regulatory approval.

39. AU SFB launches multiple products like credit cards with exclusive features

• In a bid to increase fee income, <u>AU Small Finance Bank (AU SFB) launched an array of</u> products including Rupay credit card and ATM insurance.

• Among the latest offerings are two innovative credit cards: the AU SPONT Rupay Credit Card and Secured Credit Card - NOMO (No Missing Out), developed in collaboration with NPCI and VISA, respectively.

First time in Indian banking industry, AU SFB has launched ATM Insurance, for the

convenience of customers to buy insurance through AU SFB's ATMs with their debit card. AU SFB have also launched WhatsApp Insurance where customer will get policy instantly using WhatsApp platform.

40. IndusInd Bank successfully executes RBI's programmable CBDC pilot

• <u>IndusInd Bank announced the successful execution of the Reserve Bank of India's</u> programmable Central Bank Digital Currency pilot, marking the first such instance by any bank.

• It is done in collaboration with Circularity Innovation Hub India Private Limited, involved an alternate form of CBDC wherein the bank can program the end use of funds, specifically targeting farmers.

• As a part of this pilot, IndusInd Bank initiated the programmable CBDC disbursement to 50 farmers in Ratnagiri district of Maharashtra and will cover around 1,000 farmers going ahead, marking a milestone in the adoption of innovative financial solutions for the agriculture sector.





41. RBI proposes tighter norms for LSPs offering multiple loan products

• <u>The Reserve Bank of India has issued a draft circular proposing the framework for</u> aggregation of loan products by lending service providers (LSPs) in order to ensure complete transparency for borrowers in the credit intermediation process.

• The central bank said it has observed that many LSPs -- and regulated entities (RE) acting as LSPs -- offer aggregation services for loan products through outsourcing arrangements with several lenders. Herein, the Digital Lending App/ Platform (DLA) of the LSP/RE matches the borrower to one of the lenders.

• As per the proposed norms, regulated entities will need to ensure that LSPs provide a digital view of all the loan offers available as per the borrowers' requirements, from all willing and partner LSPs. While the LSP may adopt any mechanism to ascertain the willingness of the lenders to offer a loan, it shall follow a consistent approach which has been disclosed on website.

42. RBI lays out norms for voluntary conversion of SFBs into universal banks

• RBI came out with guidelines for the voluntary conversion of small finance banks into universal banks.

• The 'Guidelines for 'on-tap' Licensing of SFBs in Private Sector', dated December 5, 2019, provide a transition path for SFBs to become universal banks.

• <u>To be eligible for conversion into a universal bank, the RBI stipulates that only listed SFBs</u> will qualify.

• <u>Those intending to convert must have a minimum net worth of Rs 1,000 crore. Also, the</u> <u>SFBs</u> <u>must have a scheduled status and a satisfactory track record of at least five years with a</u> <u>gross</u> <u>non-performing asset (NPA) of 3 per cent or less and a net NPA of 1 per cent or less in the</u> <u>past two financial years.</u>

• These instructions are issued under Section 22 (1) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

• SFBs must have reported a net profit in the past two financial years and met the prescribed capital adequacy norms.

• The RBI requires SFBs to provide a detailed rationale for their desire to convert into universal bank. Those with a diversified loan portfolio will be preferred.


• The application for transition from SFB to universal bank shall be assessed in accordance with the Guidelines for 'on tap' Licensing of Universal Banks in the Private Sector dated August 1, 2016, as applicable, and RBI (Acquisition and Holding of Shares or Voting Rights in Banking Companies) Directions, 2023, dated January 16, 2023, as amended from time to time.

43. Hitachi Payment Services announces launch of upgradable ATM

• <u>Hitachi Payment Services, one of leading names in payments and commerce solutions,</u> <u>announced the launch of the "country's first upgradable ATM." The company said that the</u> <u>upgradable ATM can be transformed into a high-performance cash recycling machine at any</u> <u>point in time.</u>

• "Manufactured under the Make in India initiative, these new upgradable ATMs provide more flexibility.

• The upgradable ATM will allow banks to safeguard their investment and expand their services to include cash deposit facilities at offsite locations later, based on their business needs and local market conditions.

1. Credit cards breach the 100 million mark in India, shows RBI data

In February 2024, the total number of credit cards issued by banks in India surpassed the 100 million mark, with an addition of 1.1 million cards from the previous month. According to the latest data released by the Reserve Bank of India, the outstanding number of credit cards in the system stood at 100.60 million.

• <u>HDFC Bank emerged as the leader in credit card issuances, with 20.40 million cards. HDFC Bank's credit card transactions dropped to Rs 40,288.51 crore from Rs 43,711.47 crore in January.</u> Similarly, ICICI Bank, Axis Bank, and SBI Card all reported decreases in transactions compared to the previous month.

2. UAE, Russia, and Saudi Among the Top Importers of Indian Engineering Goods

• <u>A near-doubling of engineering goods exports to Russia in April-February 2023-24 and an increase in shipments to free trade partner countries the UAE and Australia have led to a 1.23 per cent growth in exports (year-on-year) from this segment, at \$98.03 billion, despite an overall decline in goods exports during the period.</u>

• Exports to the US and China, two important markets for Indian engineering items, however, declined in the eleven-month period this fiscal, as per an analysis by EEPC India. <u>Engineering exports to the US in</u> <u>April-February 2023-24 declined 7 per cent to \$15.95 billion, but the region remained the top destination.</u> <u>Shipments to China, the eleventh in size, fell 1 per cent</u>.

• India's engineering exports achieved year-on-year growth for the third straight month in February 2024 and the rate of growth at 15.9 per cent was the highest in fiscal 2023-24. In February 2024, engineering exports were at \$ 9.94 billion the second highest export in fiscal 2023-24 after December 2023, the analysis noted.

• <u>The UAE was the second largest market for India with engineering exports rising 16 per cent in the</u> first eleven months to \$5.22 billion. Saudi Arabia was the third largest market with exports of engineering items spiking 75 per cent to \$4.62 billion in April-February 2023-24. India's overall goods exports in April-February 2023-24 contracted 3.45% to \$394.99 billion.

3. Second highest monthly Gross GST Revenue collection in March at '1.78 lakh crore; Records 11.5% y-o-y growth (18.4% on net basis

• Gross Good and Services Tax (GST) revenue for March 2024 witnessed the second-highest collection ever at '1.78 lakh crore, with an 11.5% year-on-year growth. This surge was driven by a significant rise in GST collection from domestic transactions at 17.6%. GST revenue net of refunds for March 2024 is Rs. 1.65 lakh crore which is the growth of 18.4% over the same period last year.

• Strong Consistent Performance in FY 2023-24: FY 2023-24 marks a milestone with total gross GST collection of Rs. 20.18 lakh crore exceeding Rs. 20 lakh crores, an 11.7% increase compared to the previous year. The average monthly collection for this fiscal year stands at Rs. 1.68 lakh crore, surpassing the previous year's average of Rs. 1.5 lakh crore.

Breakdown of March 2024 Collections:

- Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST): Rs. 34,532 crores;
- State Goods and Services Tax (SGST): Rs. 43,746 crores;
- Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST): Rs. 87,947 crores, including Rs. 40,322 crores collected on





imported goods;

• Cess: Rs. 12,259 crores, including Rs. 996 crores collected on imported goods.

4. Jobs generated under MGNREGS up 4.8%

Work generation under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) increased 4.81% to 3.1 billion person-days in 2023-24 from 2.96 billion in the previous financial year, though individual demand for work remained nearly the same at 332.7 million, as against 331.5 million in 2022-23, showed the rural development ministry data.

• <u>The number of households that got work under the flagship rural jobs scheme increased 5.76% to</u> 230.4 <u>million in 2023-24 from 217.9 million in FY23. Household demand for work under the scheme went up</u> 2.7% to 265.6 million in 2023-24 from 258.5 million in 2022-23.

5. World Bank Projects India's Economy to Grow At 7.5 Per Cent In 2024

 The Indian economy is projected to grow at 7.5 per cent in 2024, the World Bank has said, revising its earlier projections for the same period by 1.2 per cent. According to the report, South Asia is expected to remain the fastest-growing region in the world for the next two years, with growth projected to be 6.1 per cent in 2025.

• <u>According to the World Bank's most recent South Asia Development Update, overall growth in South Asia is forecast to be strong at 6 per cent in 2024</u>, driven mostly by robust development in India and recoveries in Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

6. Adani Green becomes India's first company with 10,000 MW RE capacity

• Adani Green Energy Ltd (AGEL) has commissioned 2,000 MW of solar capacity at the giant Khavda solar park in Gujarat that has made it the first company in India with over 10,000 MW of renewable energy capacity. The company now has an operating portfolio of 10,934 MW, largest in India. It has brought 2,848 MW of renewables capacity on stream in FY24.

7. Securitisation volumes for FY24 grows 4% to Rs. 1.88-lakh crore: ICRA

• <u>The overall securitisation volumes for FY24 grew 4 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y) to Rs.</u> <u>1.88-</u> <u>lakh crore despite the exit of the previous year's largest originator ' HDFC, following its</u> <u>merger with HDFC Bank, according to ICRA. The securitisation volumes are projected to</u> <u>comfortably cross Rs. 2-lakh crore in FY25 due to an increase in participation by banks as</u> <u>originators.</u>

• The rating agency noted that securitisation volumes in Q4 (January-March) FY24 witnessed a healthy growth of 26 per cent over the preceding quarter, rising to Rs. 48,000 crores. ICRA assessed that the share of pass-through certificates (PTCs) rose to 57 per cent of the market for FY24 against 40 per cent observed in the past couple of years, mainly due to the exit of HDFC.

8. ADB ups India GDP forecast to 7% for FY25 on investments, consumer demand

• The Asian Development Bank (ADB) upgraded India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth forecast for 2024-25 (FY25) to **7 per cent from 6.7 per cent** earlier, citing better prospects of robust public and private investment and strong services sector growth. The forecast is part of the latest edition of ADB's flagship economic publication, Asian Development Outlook April 2024.

• The ADB's projection is in line with the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) estimate of 7 per cent growth in FY25. The RBI's Monetary Policy Committee last week said an expected normal south-west monsoon should support agricultural activity.





9. Moody's Analytics projects India's economy to expand by 6.1% in 2024

• Moody's Analytics has projected a slight uptick in the Indian economy's growth for calendar year 2024 to 6.1 per cent from 6 per cent in March this year, lower than the growth clocked in 2023. The rating agency's arm said that India's recent consumer price inflation at around 5 per cent was without clear evidence of a trend towards slowing price pressures.

• The report also said that the Asia-Pacific region is faring relatively well compared to the rest of the world. The report forecasts 3.8 per cent growth for the APAC economy in 2024, in contrast to the global economy's 2.5 per cent growth.

• The Moody's report also said that while China and Japan are held back by weak domestic demand, the performance of India and ASEAN economies is flattered by a delayed post-pandemic rebound. The agency said that output in India remains 4 per cent lower than it would have been without the pandemic and its various aftershocks' from supply snags to military conflicts abroad.

10. Industrial production grows **5.7** per cent in Feb

India's industrial production grew 5.7 per cent in February 2024, according to official data released. The factory output measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) witnessed a growth of 6 per cent in February 2023. The data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) showed that the manufacturing sector's output grew 5 per cent in February 2024.

• In February this year, mining production rose 8 per cent, and power output increased 7.5 per cent. The IIP grew 5.9 per cent during April 2023-February 2024 compared to a 5.6 per cent expansion in the year- ago period.

11. India's exports estimate to reach 776.68 billion dollars in financial year 2023-24

• India's overall exports are estimated to reach 776.68 billion dollars in financial year 2023-24, surpassing last year's highest record. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry said in a release that that the overall exports in the preceding financial year, 2022-23, were 776.40 Billion dollars.

• The Ministry added that overall imports in the FY 2023-24 are estimated to be 854.80 Billion dollars, exhibiting a negative growth of minus 4.81 per cent compared to the preceding financial year. It further said that the overall trade deficit is estimated to significantly improve by 35.77 per cent, from 121.62 Billion dollars in FY 2022-23 to 78.12 Billion in FY 2022-23

12. WPI inflation scales 3-month high of 0.53% in March 2024

• India's wholesale inflation, based on the Wholesale Price Index, remained in positive territory for the fifth month after remaining in the negative zone for seven months until October. The annual rate of inflation based on all India Wholesale Price Index (WPI) numbers is 0.53 per cent (provisional) for March 2024 (over March 2023).

• The positive rate of inflation in March 2024 is primarily due to increase in prices of food articles, electricity, crude petroleum and natural gas, machinery and equipment and other manufacturing. The government releases index numbers of wholesale prices on a monthly basis on the 14th of every month (or the next working day).

13. India's electronics exports increase 23.6% to \$29.12 billion in FY24

• India exported electronics goods worth \$29.12 billion in 2023-24 (FY24), up 23.6 per cent compared to a year ago, even as the country's total exports contracted 3 per cent. According to commerce department officials, the top five export market of electronics good are ' the US, United Arab Emirates, Netherland, United Kingdom, and Italy.





• During FY24, exports also ventured into new markets, such as Montenegro, Cayman Islands, El Salvador, Turkmenistan, Mongolia, Honduras and St Vincent.

14. IMF Raises India's GDP Growth Projection to 6.8% for FY 2024-25

• <u>The International Monetary Fund, raised India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth projection to</u> 6.8 per cent for the financial year (FY) 2024-25. In its update to the World Economic Outlook, the IMF has raised 30 basis points from its January forecast of 6.5 per cent.

• In its report the IMF said that growth in India is projected to remain strong at 6.8% in FY 2024-25, and 6.5% in FY 2025-26 with the robustness reflecting continuing strength in domestic demand and a rising working-age population. It also said that the Global growth, estimated at 3.2 per cent in 2023, is projected to continue at the same pace in FY 2024-25 and FY 2025-26.

15. NaBFID posts net profit of Rs 1,601 cr in FY24; loans stood at Rs 35,342 cr

• <u>The National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development reported a net profit of Rs</u> 1,601.64 crore for the financial year ended March 2024 (FY24), up from Rs 1,046.39 crore in FY23. The year gone by (FY24) was the first full year of its business operations.

• The government-owned lender's total income grew to Rs 3,083.97 crore in FY24, up from Rs 1,127.06 Cr in FY23.

• The Government of India (GOI) set up NaBFID in April 2021 as India's fifth All India Financial Institution in the country to support the development of long-term non-recourse infrastructure financing in India. The authorised share capital of the Institution is Rs. 1 lakh crore, and GOI has already infused an initial capital of Rs. 20,000 crores along with a grant of Rs. 5,000 crores.

16. UNCTAD forecasts India's GDP growth at 6.5% in 2024

• Indian economy is likely to carry forward the momentum in 2024, growing 6.5% compared with 6.7% in the previous year, United Nations Trade and Development noted in its latest report, revising India's growth forecast by 0.3 percentage points. India's economy is buoyed by strong public investment and service sector growth, with a forecasted expansion of 6.5 per cent in 2024.

17. In electronics exports, Tamil Nadu jumps to top on Apple's India push

Driven by the aggressive India push from global major Apple, the southern state of Tamil Nadu has become the top state in terms of electronic goods exports in the financial year 2023-24, surpassing Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh. The state posted a 78 per cent increase in exports from \$5.37 billion in 2022-23 to \$9.56 billion in 2023-24.

• In 2023-24, Karnataka became the number two exporting state with \$4.62 billion, contributing to 16 per cent of the national exports, followed by Uttar Pradesh with \$4.46 billion worth of exports and 15 per cent of the national share. The other top states in the list are Maharashtra (\$3.09 billion), Gujarat (\$2.75 billion), Delhi (\$1.51 billion), Haryana and Telangana.

18. India's economy to grow at 8-8.3 pc in current fiscal: PHDCCI

• India's economy is estimated to grow at 8-8.3 per cent in the current fiscal, industry body PHDCCI said. The country's GDP will grow at an average of 6.7 per cent over the next 23 years to become a USD 34.7 trillion economy by 2047, with a per capita income of USD 21,000, it added.





19. Net direct tax collection surges to over Rs 19 lakh cr during last fiscal

• India's net direct tax collections for FY 2023-24 surged 17.7 per cent to 19.58 lakh crore rupees compared to 16.64 lakh crore rupees in the previous financial year and surpassed the budget estimate for FY24 by 1.35 lakh crore rupees, or 7.4 per cent. The budget estimate for direct tax mop-up for the previous fiscal was fixed at 18.23 lakh crore rupees.

• It was later revised upwards to 19.45 lakh crore rupees, and the provisional actual collections even exceeded the revised estimate by 13,000 crore rupees, the finance ministry said in a release. The gross collection of direct taxes (before adjusting for refunds) for 2023'24 also registered a healthy growth of 18.5 percent, to 23.37 lakh crore rupees in FY23.

• In personal income taxes, gross mop-up stood at 12.01 lakh crore rupees, growing 24.26 percent onyear, while in net terms it grew 25.23 percent to 10.44 lakh crore rupees registered in the preceding year. The government has issued direct tax refunds of 3.79 lakh crore rupees in 2023-24, which is an increase of 22.74 percent compared to 3.09 lakh crore rupees it issued in.

20. Net FDI in India dips to \$14.55 billion in April 2023-Februray 2024

• <u>In the same period last year (April 2022-February 2023), FDI inflows were at \$ 39.61 billion,</u> while outflows had touched \$12.90 billion during the same period.

• Repatriation/disinvestment by those who made direct investments in India rose to \$38.30 billion in the 11-months of FY24 from \$27.17 billion in April 2022-February 2023, according to RBI data.

According to the 'State of Economy' report in RBI's monthly bulletin for April 2024, more than 60 per cent of the FDI equity flows were directed towards manufacturing, computer services, electricity and other energy, retail and wholesale trade, and financial services.

• The major source countries were Singapore, Mauritius, the US, the Netherlands, Japan and the UAE, accounting for around 80 per cent of the flows. <u>India ranked fourth among Emerging Market</u> <u>Economies</u> (EMEs) in the 2024 FDI Confidence Index, reflecting continued optimism over its growth potential.

21. Credit card spends rise 27% to Rs 18.26 trillion in FY24: RBI data

• <u>Credit card spending surged 27 per cent year-on-year (Y-o-Y) to Rs 18.26 trillion in the</u> <u>financial year 2023-24 (FY24) from nearly Rs 14 trillion in the year-ago period, according to the</u> <u>latest data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).</u>

• In March 2024, credit card spending rose nearly 10.07 per cent to Rs 1.64 trillion from Rs 1.49 trillion in February.

• <u>Among the top card players, the use of HDFC Bank's credit card was at Rs 43,471.29 crore in March,</u> 8.57 per cent higher than Rs 40,288.51 crore in February. Similarly, Axis Bank posted 8.05 per cent growth in transactions to Rs 18,941.31 crore in March from Rs 17,528.97 crore in February.

• HDFC Bank is the leader in credit card issuances with the lender's cards in circulation standing at 20.59 million. Other major players include SBI Card with 18.89 million cards, ICICI Bank (16.95 million) and Axis Bank with 14.21 million cards.

22. FPI limit in G-sec unchanged at 6% of outstanding stocks of securities: RBI

• <u>RBI kept the investment limit by Foreign Portfolio Investors in government</u> securities unchanged at 6 percent of the outstanding securities stocks for 2024-25.





• Moreover, the central bank, in a statement, announced that it would maintain the FPI limits for investment in state government securities and corporate bonds **<u>at 2% and 15%</u>**, respectively, of the outstanding securities.

• The allocation of incremental changes in the g-sec limit over the two sub-categories ' 'General' and 'Long-term' ' shall be retained at 50:50 for 2024-25.

• Further, the aggregate limit of the notional amount of Credit Default Swaps sold by FPIs shall be 5 percent of the outstanding stock of corporate bonds. Accordingly, an additional limit of Rs 2,54,500 crore has been set.

23. Deloitte India pegs FY25 GDP growth at 6.6%, raises FY24 prediction

• <u>Consultancy major Deloitte raised its India GDP growth forecast for FY24 to 7.6-7.8% from</u> its earlier forecast of 6.9-7.2%, anticipating higher consumption expenditure and economic activity.

• The company said it expects India's GDP growth to be around 6.6% in FY25 and 6.75% in FY26.

• Deloitte's upward revision comes after several other entities including the IMF, World Bank, Asian Development Bank and S&P Global raised their forecasts for India's GDP growth in FY24. High growth numbers in the quarter caused India's National Statistical Office to raise its GDP growth estimate for FY24 from 7.3% in its first forecast to 7.6% in its second.

24. Economic think-tank NIPFP projects India's FY25 GDP growth at 7.1%

 Economic think-tank National Institute of Public Finance and Policy (NIPFP) said it has estimated India's GDP growth at 7.1 per cent for the current fiscal, using high-frequency models.

• The economic think tank said that in 2023-24, states' capex growth is robust due to significant capex transfers from the Centre.

• While the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Fitch Ratings have estimated India's growth at 7 per cent, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), S&P Global Ratings and Morgan Stanley projected a 6.8 per cent growth rate for FY25.

1. Vedanta's BALCO, first Indian company to be certified with ASI Performance Standard

- <u>Chhattisgarh-based Bharat Aluminum Company Limited (BALCO), a unit of Vedanta Aluminum, has emerged as the first Indian company to achieve the Aluminum Stewardship Initiative (ASI) Performance Standard V3 Certification for the manufacture and supply of a wide range of primary aluminum products at its facility in Korba.</u>
- The ASI Certification program was developed through an extensive multi-stakeholder consultation process and is the only comprehensive voluntary sustainability standard initiative for the global aluminum value chain. The ASI Performance Standard V3 defines 11 principles and 62 criteria under three sustainability pillars ' Environment, Social, and Governance.
- It aims to address sustainability areas in the aluminum value chain, such as biodiversity, indigenous peoples' rights, circularity and greenhouse gas emissions. The independent, third-party audit of Balco was carried out by CETIZION Verifica, stated the company.

2. Kodaikanal Solar Observatory celebrates 125 years of studying the Sun.

• The 125th anniversary of the iconic Kodaikanal Solar Observatory (KSO) was celebrated on 1 April 2024 by the Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA), an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), to remember the history of KSO, felicitate its scientists, and honour its legacy was a milestone for astronomy in India.

- Established on 1 April 1899 by the British, the Observatory has one of the longest continuous daily
 records of the Sun in the world, and this unique database has been digitised and is publicly available for
 astronomers from across the globe.
- Starting with these celebrations, IIA has planned a number of events over the coming months to highlight the Observatory's rich history, its diverse achievements, and its ongoing research. which in turn, arose from the Madras Observatory established in 1792.
- <u>Currently, KSO is operational as a field station under the Indian Institute of Astrophysics,</u> which is an autonomous institution under the Department of Science and Technology. 1st <u>April is also celebrated by Indian Institute of Astrophysics as its Foundation Day,</u> commemorating when it was constituted as an institution under the Department of Science & <u>Technology in 1971.</u>

3. India plans to cease importing urea by the end of 2025

• As a result of a significant push for domestic manufacturing, India will no longer import urea by the end of 2025, according to the Ministry Chemicals and Fertilisers.

- The government is currently working to promote alternative fertilisers including nanoliquid urea and nanoliquid di-ammonium phosphate.
- Using different fertilisers improves the health of the soil and crops.





4. Miraj Sitar to Kutch Bandhani: GI tags cross 600 in FY24

• The total number of geographical indications registered in India has crossed the 600-market in 2023-24 with as many as 63 GI registrations being issued by the Intellectual Property Office on a single day - March 30, 2024. Of the 1,158 applications filed over the past 20 years, 635 are now GI registered.

• With this, UP has now overtaken Tamil Nadu as the state with the highest number of GIs registered at 69, while TN now has 58 GIs. Out of the 63 GIs issued on March 30, 2024, by the IP office, Assam registered the highest number of GIs during FY24 at 19, followed by UP and Maharashtra with 16 each, Gujarat with five, Meghalaya with four and Tripura with two.

• <u>The sitars and tanpuras of Miraj, a small town in Maharashtra's Sangli district known</u> for its craftsmanship in making musical instruments, have been awarded the coveted <u>Geographical Indication (GI) tags.</u>

5. India eyes 100 GW nuclear power by 2047: AEC chairman

• India aims to increase its nuclear power production to 1 lakh MW by 2047, a significant jump from the current 8,000 MW. This goal was highlighted by Atomic Energy Commission Chairman A K Mohanty at the release of a report on energy transitions. The report emphasized the need for nuclear power in India's energy transition.

• He said the breeder reactors would contribute 3 GW of nuclear power, while 17.6 GW would come from light water reactors built with international cooperation and another 40-45 GW would come from the pressurized heavy water reactors.

6. 'Experimental Licence Module for 100 5G Labs' launched at IIT Madras

• <u>In a move to smoothen the processes for 100 5G Labs across academic institutions in India, one of</u> the <u>"Experimental Licence modules for 100 5G Labs" was launched during a 5G workshop at IIT Madras.</u> This initiative aims to simplify the experimental licence requirements for these institutions, facilitating smoother operations and fostering innovation in the 5G domain.

• The primary objective behind this initiative is to cultivate competencies and engagement in 5G technologies among students and start-up communities. These labs will be using 5G frequency bands for carrying out various experiments. This license is currently being issued on 'Self-declaration Mode' from the Saralsanchar portal of DoT through the National Single Window System.

7. Citron becomes the first multinational carmaker to export EVs from India

• French carmaker Citron became the first multinational car manufacturer in India to export domestically made electric vehicles to the international market. The company announced the commencement of exports of locally manufactured -C3. The initial shipment of 500 units of the Made-in- India Citron -C3 to Indonesia was ceremonially flagged from Kamarajar Port

8. NIIF invests \$200 million in Ibus to boost digital infrastructure in India

• <u>The National Investment and Infrastructure Fund (NIIF) announced a USD 200 million (about Rs</u> <u>1,660</u> <u>crore) investment in digital infrastructure player Ibus Network and Infrastructure.</u> Ibus will be deploying the funds to scale operations in an organic way by expanding its capacities and for inorganic growth.

9. Adani Group Builds World's Largest Renewable Energy Park in Gujarat

• <u>Adani Green Energy Limited is developing a 30 GW renewable energy plant on barren land at</u> <u>Khavda in</u> <u>Kutch of Gujarat over an area of 538 sq km after which it would become the planet's largest</u> <u>power plant</u>





<u>regardless of the energy source.</u> The area of the project in Khavda is five times the size of Paris and almost as large as Mumbai.

• The project was started in December 2022 and the first production was made on December 31, 2023. Adani Green Energy Limited will invest about Rs 1.5 lakh crore and Adani group will invest about Rs 2.3 lakh crore in renewable energy and manufacturing capacity by 2030.

10. Japanese consortium to invest \$370 mn in Natural Gas Transition Platform

• A Japanese consortium will invest \$370 million to acquire a minority stake in a platform that invests in companies developing city gas distribution networks in India, global infrastructure investor I Squared Capital. Osaka Gas, Sumitomo Corp and a Japanese government-private sponsored investment fund, will invest in Indian companies that develop natural gas infrastructure.

<u>The platform, called the Natural Gas Transition Platform, has investments in last-mile city gas</u> distribution businesses including THINK Gas and AG&P Pratham that are developing city gas infrastructure across 19 geographical areas covering 325,000 square kilometres

11. CDP-SURAKSHA, a Digital Platform for Horticulture Subsidies launched

• <u>The CDP-SURAKSHA is essentially a digital platform. SURAKSHA stands for 'System for Unified</u> <u>Resource Allocation, Knowledge, and Secure Horticulture Assistance.</u> The platform will allow an instant disbursal of subsidies to farmers in their bank account by utilising the e-RUPI voucher.

Under the Cluster Development Programme, the Indian government has launched a new platform for providing horticultural farmers with subsidies. It has been launched by Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare. It has database integration with PM-KISAN, cloud-based server space, NIC, UIDAI validation, eRUPI integration, local government directory, geo tagging& geo fencing.

12. IIT Madras launches India's 1st mobile medical devices calibration facility

 <u>Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras launched India's first medical devices calibration</u> <u>facility on wheels. The initiative boosts the United National Sustainable Development Goal</u> (SDG-3), which calls for health and well-being for all.

• Calibration is key for life-saving medical devices as it will help check the accuracy of medical instruments for precise disease diagnosis, which will lead to improved treatments. The infrastructure in the mobile unit includes state-of-the-art equipment that will test the safety of medical devices as per international standards.

13. Hindustan Zinc becomes 3rd largest silver producer globally

• <u>Vedanta group firm Hindustan Zinc said it has become the third largest producer of silver globally.</u>

• As per a survey, its Sindesar Khurd Mine in Rajasthan now stands as the world's second-largest silver- producing mine, moving up from last year's fourth spot, the company said in a statement.

• Hindustan Zinc, a Vedanta Group company in zinc, lead and silver businesses, is the world's second-largest integrated zinc producer and now the third-largest silver producer. The company has a market share of 75 per cent of the growing zinc market in India with its headquarters in Udaipur along with zinc, lead mines and smelting complexes spread across Rajasthan.





14. Fin Min notifies FEMA tweaks to pave the way for new FDI limits in space sector

• The Finance Ministry notified amendments to the Foreign Exchange Management (Non-debt Instruments) Rules, 2019 to operationalise the new foreign direct investment limits for satellite-related activities. Up to 100 per cent FDI is now allowed under the automatic route for manufacturing of components and systems or sub-systems for satellites, ground segments and user segments.

• Up to 74 per cent FDI is now permitted under the automatic route for satellite manufacturing and operation, satellite data products and Ground Segment and User Segment. FDI of over 74 per cent in these activities will require the government's approval.

• Up to 49 per cent will be permitted under the automatic route for launch vehicles and associated systems or sub-systems and the creation of spaceports for launching and receiving spacecraft. Beyond this limit, government approval will be required.

15. SJVN Green Energy forms JV with Assam Power Distribution Company

• State-owned power producer SJVN Limited on said its wholly-owned arm SJVN Green Energy has incorporated a joint venture company with Assam Power Distribution Company to generate electricity from renewable sources. SJVN Green Energy will hold 51 per cent of SGEL Assam Renewable Energy.

• The joint venture company, SGEL Assam Renewable Energy, shall carry out business in the field of power generation from all renewable energy sources including hydropower by setting up power plants, SJVN said in a regulatory filing said.

16. Gi Tag To Kashi's Tirangi Barfi, 5 Other Items Of Up

• Six more products from Uttar Pradesh have been given the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.

• These include the famous 'Tirangi Barfi' of Kashi, a tricoloured sweet that was sold to prove a point by freedom fighters during the Quit India Movement. With these additions, UP retains its position as the state with the most GI-tagged products in India, reaching a total of 75.

 <u>The other products that received the certification in Uttar Pradesh include Banaras Metal</u> <u>Casting Craft, Lakhimpur Kheri Tharu Embroidery, Bareilly Cane and Bamboo Craft, Bareilly</u> <u>Zardozi Craft, and Pilkhuwa Hand Block Print Textile. Tamil Nadu follows behind with 58 GI</u> <u>products.</u>

17. PM inaugurates 2550th Bhagwan Mahaveer Nirvan Mahotsav on occasion of Mahaveer Jayanti

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi released a commemorative stamp and coin at the inauguration of the 2550th Bhagwan Mahaveer Nirvan Mahotsav, on the occasion of Mahaveer Jayanti at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi.

• Bhagwan Mahavir, the 24th Tirthankar, illuminated the path of peaceful co-existence and universal brotherhood through Jain principles like Ahimsa (Non-Violence), Satya (Truthfulness), Asteya (Non- Stealing), Brahmacharya (Chastity) and Aparigraha (Non-attachment).

18. Indian Historical Records Commission (IHRC) Adopts a New Logo and Motto

• The Indian Historical Records Commission (IHRC), an apex advisory body on archival matters, acts as an all-India forum of creators, custodians and users of records to advise the Government of India on the management of records and their use for historical research.

• Established in 1919, the IHRC is headed by the Union Minister of Culture.





• The logo signifies the theme and uniqueness of IHRC entirely. The pages in the shape of lotus petals represent IHRC as the resilient nodal institution for maintaining historical records. The Sarnath pillar in the middle represents India's glorious past. Brown as the colour theme reinforces the organization's mission of preserving, studying and honouring India's history. The motto translates as "Where history is preserved for the future."

19. REC Limited avails SACE-Covered Green Loan for \sim 60.5 Billion Japanese Yen

In a significant step towards sustainable development in India, REC Limited, a Maharatna Central Public Sector Enterprise and leading NBFC under the Ministry of Power, has successfully availed a Green Loan of Japanese Yen (JPY) 60.536 billion to finance eligible green projects in India.

• The green loan facility benefits from an 80% guarantee by Italian Export Credit Agency, SACE (Italy) under their innovative Push Strategy programme.

• The arrangement between SACE and REC is a breakthrough and a first-of-its-kind collaboration between an Indian government entity and SACE.

• The green loan facility sets a benchmark in the Indian public sector landscape, for similar green financing transactions, highlighting a growing commitment to sustainable financing. The facility also marks SACE's first JPY-denominated loan transaction and first green loan transaction in India.

• Loan has loan participation from banks across Asia, USA and Europe, namely Crdit Agricole Corporate and Investment Bank, Bank of America, Citibank, KfW IPEX-Bank & Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corporation as Mandated Lead Arrangers. Crdit Agricole Corporate and Investment Bank would be acting as the Export Credit Agency Coordinator, Green Loan Coordinator & Documentation bank.

20. SJVN sets milestone with Inauguration of First Multi-purpose Green Hydrogen Pilot Project of the Nation

• <u>SJVN Limited has achieved a significant milestone with the inauguration of India's first</u> <u>Multi-</u> <u>purpose Green Hydrogen Pilot Project at SJVN's 1,500 MW Nathpa Jhakri Hydro Power</u> <u>Station in Jhakri, Himachal Pradesh.</u>

• The green hydrogen produced from the project will be utilized for High Velocity Oxygen Fuel Coating Facility of NJHPS for meeting its combustion fuel requirements



• The comprehensive strategy aims to address India's escalating need for green financing. Despite the pressing demand, where India requires approximately \$170 billion annually to reach a cumulative total of over \$2.5 trillion by 2030, current green finance inflows are critically insufficient.

• NABARD's Climate Strategy 2030 is structured around four key pillars to address this demand: (i) Accelerating Green Lending across sectors, (ii) Playing a broader Market-Making Role (iii) Internal Green Transformation of NABARD, and (iv) Strategic Resource Mobilization.







22. APSEZ's Vizhinjam Port gets nod to run as India's first transshipment hub

• <u>The Centre has given sanction to Adani's Vizhinjam Port in Kerala to operate</u> as a transshipment port -- a first for the country.

• A transshipment port is a crucial hub where cargo is transferred from one big vessel to several smaller ones before they reach the final port of discharge. It will now help India in its ambition to become a manufacturing hub.





International

1. Bulgaria and Romania partially join Europe's Schengen area

• <u>After a 13-year wait, Bulgaria and Romania have partially joined Europe's Schengen area</u> of free movement. The two countries reached an agreement late last year to join the continent's free-travel area by air and sea after Austria opposed full membership, including land crossings, saying Romania and Bulgaria needed to do more to prevent irregular migration.

- Created in 1985, the Schengen area allows more than 400 million people in the European Union to travel freely without internal border controls. One of the main aims of the Schengen area is to protect its citizens through increased cooperation between the police forces, customs authorities and external border control authorities of all the member states.
- Countries in Schengen area are: Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.

2. El-Sisi sworn in for third term as Egyptian president

• <u>Eqyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi sworn in for his third term as President</u>. Sisi had won the Presidential election with 89.6 % of the vote in December last year. He is set to remain president until 2030. As Egypt has battled a deep economic crisis with the help of billions in overseas loans and investments, he pledged to build a modern and democratic state.

3. Democratic Republic Of Congo Appoints Judith Suminwa Tuluka As African Nation's First Woman Prime Minister

• <u>The Democratic Republic of Congo appointed Judith Suminwa Tuluka as the African nation's first</u> <u>woman</u> <u>Prime Minister.</u> President Felix Tshisekedi of the Democratic Republic of Congo made the appointment. he authorities face a raft of challenges including a worsening conflict and humanitarian crisis in eastern regions and the management of Congo's considerable mineral wealth.

4. India removes export curbs on essential goods for Maldives

• India has removed export curbs on specified quantities of certain commodities like eggs, potatoes, onions, rice, wheat flour, sugar, and dal for Maldives in the current fiscal year. The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), in a notification, said these exports have been permitted to Maldives under the bilateral trade agreement between countries during 2024-25. <u>Maldives is an island and atoll in the Indian Ocean. Maldives capital city is Male.</u>

5. The US and the UK sign agreement on AI safety testing

• <u>The United States and the United Kingdom have recently signed an agreement to work</u> together on developing tests for the most advanced artificial intelligence(AI) models.

• Under this agreement, both the countries will share vital information about the capabilities and risks associated with AI models and systems, fundamental technical research on AI safety and security, etc.

6. Zimbabwe launches new gold-backed currency - ZiG

 Zimbabwe has introduced a new gold-backed currency called ZiG - the name stands for "Zimbabwe Gold". It is the latest attempt to stabilise an economy that has lurched from crisis to





crisis for the past 25 years. The ZiG replaces a Zimbabwean dollar, the RTGS, that had lost three-quarters of its value so far this year.

• <u>The new ZiG banknotes come in denominations of between 1 and 200. Zimbabweans have a historic mistrust of the central bank, dating back to 2008, when it was printing Z\$10tn notes while inflation had run out of control.</u>

• It then abolished its own currency and for many years only used foreign banknotes such as the US dollar and the South African rand.

7. US, UK forge an alliance to standardise testing public safety in AI models

• <u>The United States and Britain have announced a new partnership in which they will be</u> working together to address concerns about the safety of artificial intelligence (AI) technologies. Under the formal partnership, Britain and the United States plan to conduct joint testing exercises on publicly accessible AI models.

8. Russia launches first Angara-A5 space rocket from Far East cosmodrome

• <u>The flagship Angara A5 -- a powerful spacecraft designed to carry heavy payloads into low</u> <u>Earth orbit -- took off from the Vostochny Cosmodrome in the Russian Far East.</u> The Angara family of rockets, developed to replace the Soviet-designed Proton rockets, is central to Russia's strategy to secure its independence in accessing outer space and to reduce reliance.

9. Sweden Becomes 38th Signatory to the Artemis Accords

Sweden became the 38th country to sign the Artemis Accords.

• Currently, United States, India and Japan are the only leading spacefaring nations to sign the accords. The accords are a series of non-binding arrangements aimed at setting down norms to be followed in outer space.

About Artemis Accords: -

- The Artemis Accords were initially announced by NASA and the US Department of State in 2020 and it now has 38 signatories, including India and Japan.
- It provides for the implementation of key obligations from the 1967 Outer Space Treaty and reinforces commitment to the Registration Convention, the Rescue and Return Agreement and also best practices of responsible behaviour.

10. 10 MDBs Jointly Launch Global Co-financing Platform

- 10 multilateral development banks have joined forces to launch a digital initiative that aims to transform the development finance landscape, potentially unlocking substantial additional financing.
- The Global Collaborative Co-financing Platform, will be a digital marketplace that brings together a curated list of projects seeking co-financing from participating institutions

• Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank and the World Bank, along with the African Development Bank, Asian Development Bank, Council of Europe Development Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, European Investment Bank, Inter-American Development Bank, Islamic Development Bank and New Development Bank are joining at this initial stage for collaboration.

1. Italy's Jannik Sinner Clinches Men's Single Title of Miami Open Tennis in US

• **Italy's Jannik Sinner won the Men's Singles title of Miami Open tournament in the United States.** Second seed Sinner defeated 11th seed Bulgarian player Grigor Dimitrov 6-3, 6-1 in the final. <u>Sinner's third title of the season means he will move to a career-high second in the ATP world</u> <u>rankings, ahead of Spain's Carlos Alcaraz.</u>

• Unseeded American player Danielle Collins has won the Women's Singles title. In a major upset, Collins defeated fourth-seeded Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan in straight sets 7-5, 6-3 in the final.

2. Rohan Bopanna with his Australian partner Matthew Ebden creates history in men's doubles final at Miami Open.

• **Indian tennis star Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden clinched a historic victory in the men's doubles final at the Miami Open.** The 44-year-old Bopanna became the oldest man to win an ATP Masters 1000 title and the second Indian to reach the finals of all nine ATP Masters 1000 events. With this win, he also regained the top spot in the ATP rankings.

3. Mirabai Chanu Becomes The Only Indian Weightlifter To Qualify For Paris Olympics

• <u>Tokyo Olympics medallist Mirabai Chanu became the only Indian weightlifter to qualify for</u> the <u>Paris Olympics this year after competing successfully at the IWF World Cup in Phuket,</u> <u>Thailand.</u> The 29-year-old Olympic silver medalist finished third in Group B of the women's 49kg (and 11th overall) at the event to book her berth at the 2024 Paris Games.

4. Sumit Nagal becomes first ever Indian to win main draw match in Monte Carlo Masters

 Indian tennis player Sumit Nagal stuns 35th ranked Matteo Arnaldi and becomes first ever Indian to win main draw match at Monte Carlo Masters. He defeated Arnaldi. The unseeded 95th-ranked Nagal, is only the third Indian to feature in the main draw in Monte Carlo after Vijay Amritraj in 1977 and Ramesh Krishnan in 1982. He became the first-ever male Indian singles player to win a Masters 1000 match on clay.

5. Mendis and Bouchier named ICC Players of the Month for March

<u>Kamindu Mendis claims the ICC Men's Player of the Month award after his historic efforts at the crease helped Sri Lanka comfortably win the first Test in their ICC World Test Championship showdown against Bangladesh.</u>

• <u>England's Maia Bouchier wins the ICC Women's Player of the Month prize thanks to a sparkling</u> series of scores in New Zealand as the tourists secured a win.

6. Sunrisers break own record for highest total, score 287 runs in 20 overs

• <u>Sunrisers Hyderabad on April 15 broke their record of scoring the highest runs in the</u> <u>IPL, as they hammered 287 runs in 20 overs while playing against Royal Challengers Bangalore</u> <u>at M Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru.</u> In the innings, 22 whopping sixes were shot, along with 19 boundaries, by the power hitters of Sunrisers Hyderabad ' Travis Head (102), Abhishek Sharma (34).

7. India's 17-Year-Old D Gukesh Wins Candidates Chess Tournament: Creates History

 <u>In Chess, 17-year-old Indian prodigy, Dommaraju Gukesh made history as the</u> youngest-ever player to win the FIDE Candidates tournament in Toronto. In the final round, Gukesh held fellow title





contender Hikaru Nakamura of USA to a draw with black pieces but his fate was sealed on the other board where Ian Nepomniachtchi and Fabiano Caruana battled for 109 moves before draw.

• <u>Gukesh became the youngest-ever Candidates Tournament champion, beating Garry Kasparov's</u> record, who was 20 years when he won this tournament in 1984. After Vishwanathan Anand, he becomes the second Indian to qualify for the World Chess Championship. With this amazing victory, Gukesh will challenge the reigning Champion Ding Liren of China in the World Chess Championship.

8. Indonesia's Christie takes Asia badminton crown

Indonesia's Jonatan Christie cliched the Badminton Asia Championships crown, seeing off
 Shi Feng in two sets in China. Christie defeated home favourite Li 21-15, 21-16 in the
 tournament finale in the Chinese city of Ningbo.
 The men's doubles title was claimed by Chinese pair
 Liang Wei Keng and Wang Chang, who dispatched Malaysian duo Goh Sze Fei and Nur Izzuddin.

• Earlier China's Wang Zhi Yi swatted aside compatriot Chen Yu Fei 21-19, 21-7 to claim the women's singles title. South Korean partners Baek Ha-na and Lee So-hee took the women's doubles title by beating China's Zhang Shu Xian and Zheng Yu 23-21, 21-12.

9. Balraj Panwar secures India's 1st Paris Olympics quota in rowing in men's single scull event of 2024 World Asian

• <u>Balraj Panwar secured India's first Paris Olympics quota in rowing by securing 3rd</u> <u>position in the men's single scull event of the 2024 World Asian and Oceanian Olympic &</u> <u>Paralympic</u> <u>Qualification Regatta at South Korea.</u> The 25-year-old rower from Indian Army demonstrated remarkable performance by clocking 7 minutes and 1.27sec in the 2000-metre race securing the quota.

10. Rajasthan Royals' Yuzvendra Chahal creates history, becomes first-ever bowler to take 200 IPL wickets

• Star Rajasthan Royals leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal created history, becoming the first bowler ever to take 200 wickets in the Indian Premier League. Chahal got to the landmark in the game against Mumbai Indians at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium in Jaipur. Chahal, who made his IPL debut in 2013 got to the feat in his 153rd game.

11. Max Verstappen canters to victory at Chinese Grand Prix: F1

• **Red Bull's Max Verstappen won the first Chinese Grand Prix in five years, the fifth round of** the **2024 Formula 1 World Championship, in Shanghai.** Verstappen beat McLaren's Lando Norris and Red Bull team-mate Sergio Perez in a race that was twice interrupted by the safety car.

12. Former Wrestler Narsingh Yadav Elected Chairman of WFI's Athletes' Commission

Former Commonwealth Games gold-medallist Narsingh Pancham Yadav was elected chairman of the Wrestling Federation of India's (WFI) Athletes' Commission.

• A total of eight candidates were in fray for the seven positions and after polling, conducted on ballot paper, seven members got elected.

• They then chose Narsingh as chairman of the commission

13. India legend Yuvraj Singh named ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 ambassador

• <u>The International Cricket Council (ICC) announced India legend Yuvraj Singh as an ICC Men's T20</u> World Cup 2024 ambassador, which will be played in the West Indies and USA from June 1 to 29.

1. UNICEF India with IIHMR Delhi and IIT Mumbai launch digital health course to bridge techknowledge gaps





Ranks & Reports

1. India to lose 5.8% of daily working hours amid heat stress in 2030: UNESCAP

• India is expected to lose around 5.8 per cent of daily working hours due to rising temperatures by 2030, leading to erosion in productivity and lower collection of fiscal revenue, said a recent report released by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP).

• The report also mentions that climate change will contribute to the spread of disease, leading to lower government revenues and higher spending requirements as fiscal expenditure is required for mitigating such adverse effects and building resilience. The report also notes that the Asia and Pacific region, including India, is home to 600 million youth aged between 15-24year.

2. Unicorns list: US has 703, China 340. India is 3rd globally with these many

• According to the Hurun Global Unicorn Index 2024, India for the first time recorded a decline in unicorn creation since 2017. India in 2023 had 67 unicorns, which is one less than 68 such startups last year, according to the latest Hurun Global Unicorn Index. The US led the list with 703 unicorns, up 37 from 2022, and China woth 340 unicorns.

• <u>UK and EU ranked No 4 and No 5 in the list, respectively.</u> The total value of the world's unicorns have reached US\$5 trillion, equivalent to last year's GDP of Japan. <u>The report noted that the top 10</u> <u>unicorns</u> were in China and the US. Indians have founded more offshore unicorns than any other country, cofounding 109 unicorns outside of India compared with 67 in India.

3. Climate Change Poses Challenges For Monetary Policy: RBI

• Frequent weather shocks caused by climate change pose challenges for the monetary policy as well as downside risks to economic growth, a Reserve Bank report said.

• Global average temperatures are on a rise, with accompanying increase in extreme weather events, and the economic and social impact of global warming is becoming increasingly evident, said RBI's Monetary Policy.

• The report said that climate change has increased the frequency and ferocity of weather shocks, posing challenges for monetary policy. <u>In the absence of any climate mitigation policies, the long-term</u> output will be lower by around 9 per cent by 2050 vis--vis a no climate change scenario with full pass-through of the physical risks of climate change to the economy.

4. WTO pares down projected merchandise trade volume growth to 2.6% for FY24

• <u>World Trade Organization revised downwards its projection for merchandise trade</u> volume growth to 2.6% for 2024 from 3.3% estimated in October.

• However, the multilateral trade body, in its latest bi-annual 'Global Trade Outlook and Statistics', said after a contraction of 1.2% in 2023, demand for traded goods will rebound in 2024.

• In October last year, it had projected merchandise trade volume to grow 0.8 per cent in 2023.

• According to the report, India's rank among leading merchandise exporters (excluding intra-EU trade) improved by a notch to 13 in 2023 from the preceding year, though its share remained unchanged at 2.2 per cent.





• India's rank among leading exporters of commercial services (excluding intra-EU trade) remained unchanged at 5 in 2023 from the preceding year, with its share remaining the same at 5.4 per cent.

 However, <u>India's rank dropped a notch to 6 among major importers of commercial services. Its</u> share <u>declined to 4.2 per cent from 4.8 per cent</u> in the preceding year.

5. JNU India's highest-ranked university: QS World University Rankings

• <u>As many as 69 Indian universities have made it to the latest 'QS World University</u> <u>Rankings' with a total of 424 entries across 55 subjects, a 19.4 per cent jump from the</u> <u>previous year's 355.</u>

• With this, India became the 2nd most represented country in Asia after China whose 101 institutions were on the list compiled by global higher education experts QS Quacquarelli Symonds.

• The Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) emerged as the highest ranked Indian university in the list. Under the subject of Development Studies, JNU was ranked 20th in the QS World University Rankings. IIM Ahmedabad grabbed the next best rank of 22nd in the subject of Business & Management Studies. IIM Bangalore stood first in Accounting & Finance subject.

• The Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay (IITB) secured 25th rank in the subject of Engineering- Mineral & Mining. Indian Institute of Technology, Madras (IITM) secured 29th spot in Petroleum Engineering.

<u>A total of 69 Indian universities made it to the rankings with 424 entries across all subjects. It was</u>
 <u>19.4 per cent higher than the previous year's 355 entries.</u>

6. India ranks number 10 in cybercrime, Russia tops list followed by Ukraine

• <u>An international team of researchers has compiled the 'World Cybercrime Index' that ranks</u> roughly 100 countries and identifies key hotspots according to various categories of cybercrime, including ransomware, credit card theft and scams. India ranked number 10 in cybercrime, with frauds involving people to make advance fee payment being the most common type.

• Russia topped the list, and was followed by Ukraine, China, the US, Nigeria and Romania. North Korea was at the seventh position, while the UK and Brazil were at the eighth and ninth positions, respectively, according to the research published in the journal PLoS ONE.

• The major categories that the researchers identified were - technical products and services such as malware and compromising systems; attacks and extortion including ransomware; data and identity theft including hacking, compromising accounts and credit cards; scams such as advance fee fraud; and cashing out or money laundering involving illegitimate virtual currency.

7. India outpaces China in digital services exports: WTO report

• India has secured its place as the world's 4th largest exporter of digitally delivered services, contributing more than a fifth to the global trade in services. As per recent Global Trade Outlook and Statistics report by World Trade Organisation, India's exports of digitally delivered services reached \$257 billion in 2023, marking a 17% increase compared to previous year.

• This growth outpaced that of Germany and China, which saw 4% growth each. <u>The report</u> highlights that globally, exports of digitally delivered services surged to \$4.25 trillion in 2023, marking a 9% year-on-year increase. This accounted for 13.8% of world exports of goods and services.





8. India lost 2.33 million hectares of tree cover since 2000

India has lost 2.33 million hectares of tree cover since 2000, equivalent to a six per cent

decrease in tree cover during this period, according to the latest data from the Global Forest Watch monitoring project. Between 2001 and 2022, it said, forests in India emitted 51 million tons of carbon dioxide equivalent a year and removed 141 million tons of carbon dioxide.

• The Global Forest Watch, which tracks forest changes in near real-time using satellite data and other sources, said the country lost 4,14,000 hectares of humid primary forest (4.1 per cent) from 2002 to 2023, making up 18 per cent of its total tree cover loss in the same period.

• <u>The data showed that 95 per cent of the tree cover loss in India from 2013 to 2023</u> occurred within natural forests. The GFW data showed that five states accounted for 60 per cent of all tree cover loss between 2001 and 2023.

• Assam had the maximum tree cover loss at 324,000 hectares compared to an average of 66,600 hectares. Mizoram lost 312,000 hectares of tree cover.

• Arunachal Pradesh 262,000 hectares, Nagaland 259,000 hectares, and Manipur 240,000 hectares. From 2001 to 2022, Odisha had the highest rate of tree cover loss due to fires with an average of 238 hectares lost per year. Arunachal Pradesh lost 198 hectares, Nagaland 195 hectares, Assam 116 hectares, and Meghalaya 97 hectares.

9. Delhi Airport Among Top 10 Busiest Airports In World

• <u>The Delhi airport, also known as Indra Gandhi International (IGI) airport has been ranked</u> <u>among the top 10 busiest airports across the globe for 2023.</u> The Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta <u>International Airport topped the list followed by Dubai and Dallas airports at the second and third position</u>, according to the ranks prepared by Airports Council International (ACI) World.

• Among the top ten busiest airports five are alone from the US. The biggest jump in the top 10 rankings was recorded for Tokyo Haneda, leaping from 16th position in 2022 to the 5th spot in 2023.

10. Extreme weather conditions may pose risk to inflation: RBI Bulletin

• The Reserve Bank of India's April bulletin has said that conditions are shaping up for an extension of a trend upshift in real GDP growth, backed by strong investment demand and upbeat business and consumer sentiments. The article titled 'State of the Economy' says that CPI inflation settled at 4.9 percent in March after averaging 5.1 percent in the preceding two months.

• <u>Another article 'Food and Fuel Prices: Second Round Effects on Headline Inflation in India' claims that</u> impact of food shock on core inflation has reduced over time while that of fuel shock has increased recently. It adds that the second-round effects of food and fuel inflation on headline inflation have become subdued, especially after the adoption of inflation targeting.

• <u>The bulletin has also published an article on 'India's Foreign Exchange Reserves in High Volatility</u> <u>Episodes: 'An Empirical Assessment'.</u> This article analyzes the trend in India's foreign exchange reserves during major high-volatility episodes like Global Financial Crisis, Eurozone debt crisis, the US-China trade war, the recent Russia-Ukraine conflict & US monetary policy.

• It indicates that the Reserve Bank has managed to contain rupee volatility and keep forex markets largely stable in all high-volatility episodes. It adds that rupee volatility has remained lowest among currencies of major emerging and advanced economies, despite unprecedented headwinds, especially during the Russia- Ukraine war.





11. Indian passport 'second cheapest' in the world, next only to UAE's; offers visa-free access to 62 countries: Study

• A recent study has revealed that the **Indian passport ranks as the 2nd cheapest passport to obtain worldwide.** It holds the distinction of being the most cost-effective in terms of "cost per year" of validity. An Indian passport holder can travel to 62 nations visa-free. Australian firm Compare the Market AU conducted comparison of passport acquisition costs across countries.

• <u>The UAE passport clinches the top spot as the most affordable passport globally</u>, surpassing all others in terms of both acquisition cost and the number of countries offering visa-free access. <u>According</u> to the study, Mexico has the most expensive passport in the world followed by Australia.

12. India's population estimated at 144 crore, 24% in 0-14 age bracket: UNFPA report

• India's population is estimated to have reached 144 crores, with 24% in the 0-14 age bracket, according to a recent report by UNFPA. United Nations Population Fund's State of World Population - 2024 report -- "Interwoven Lives, Threads of Hope: Ending Inequalities in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights" -- revealed India's population is estimated to double in 77 years.

• India leads globally with an estimated population of 144.17 crore, followed by China at 142.5 crore, according to the report.

• India's population was recorded at 121 crores during the last census, conducted in 2011. <u>The</u> report further detailed that an estimated 24 per cent of India's population is aged 0-14 while 17 per cent is within the 10-19 age range.

13. Reliance Jio becomes world's largest mobile operator in data traffic

• <u>Reliance Jio has become the world's largest mobile operator in data traffic</u> <u>consumption, surpassing China Mobile.</u>

• According to global analytics firm Tefficient, the Indian telecom operator's total traffic reached 40.9 exabytes in the January-March quarter, compared to China Mobile's 38.

• Jio also has the second-largest 5G subscriber base globally, with 108 million users.

14. Karnataka, Gujarat exhibit strong commitment to clean energy transition

• The 2024 Indian States' Electricity Transition (SET), a joint report by the Institute for Energy Economics and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) and Ember, reveals that both the states (Karnataka and Gujarat) are making big strides in decarbonisation and are adequately prepared to accelerate the transition with robust market enablers facilitating future growth.

More about the Report:

• States such as Kerala, Haryana, Andhra Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Maharashtra showed strong progress in one or more of the three dimensions ' Decarbonisation, Readiness and Performance of the Power Ecosystem and Market Enablers. Odisha exhibits preparedness to embrace electricity transition through the readiness of its market enablers.

• Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh moved slower than others again in SET 2024, despite the changes to our assessment parameters. The first edition of the SET report in 2023 analysed 16 states to help identify areas that require action and attention at the state level. This year's report builds on that work by expanding the scope to 21 states.





Important Days

1. World Autism Awareness Day | 2 April

• Ever since the United Nations General Assembly designated **2 April as World Autism Awareness Day (WAAD)** in 2007, the United Nations has observed the day as a means to affirm and promote the full realization of all human rights and fundamental freedoms for autistic people on an equal basis with others.

2. Prevention of Blindness Week | 1-7 April

• The Indian government designates **April 1 to April 7 as Prevention of Blindness Week.** This observance serves as a poignant call to individuals, emphasising the importance of prudent lifestyle choices and regular eye examinations to mitigate the risk of eye ailments, including age-related macular degeneration.

- Jawaharlal Nehru and Raj Kumari Amrit Kaur founded the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness in 1960 under the Societies Registration Act of 1860.
- It is an entirely voluntary organisation that accepts donations and contributions and actively collaborates with Sight Savers, Rotary International and other significant companies.

3. International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action | 4 April

On 8 December 2005, the General Assembly declared that 4 April of each year shall be

observed as the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action. This year, the annual event will be further strengthened by the preliminary launch of the National Mine Action Strategy, developed in partnership with the GICHD.

• On 4 April 2024, The National Mine Action Authority (NMAA), in partnership with the United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS), and the Geneva International Center for Humanitarian Demining (GICHD), will commemorate the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action on 4 April 2024, under **the theme 'Protecting Lives, Building Peace.'**

4. International Day of Conscience | 5 April

• **Each year on 5 April, the International Day of Conscience is celebrated.** The United Nations established this day to draw attention to the importance of self-examination and acting morally. The day also offers an opportunity to reflect on the progress made in promoting peace and social justice and to identify areas where more work needs to be done.

<u>This year, the International Day of Conscience is marked with the theme 'Promoting</u> the <u>Culture of Peace with Love and Conscience.'</u>

5. National Maritime Day | 5 April

• Every year, April 5 is observed as National Maritime Day to spread awareness about

international trade and economy. On this day, the "NMD Award of Excellence" is also presented to honour the individuals for their lifetime distinguished and exceptional achievements in the Indian maritime sector at the senior level.





• <u>This day was first observed on April 5, 1964</u>, informing people and spreading awareness about intercontinental commerce and the economy worldwide. <u>The theme for National Maritime Day 2024 is</u> <u>"Navigating the future: safety first!"</u> The maritime sector plays an immense role when it comes to international trade and the economy.

6. International Day of Sport for Development and Peace | 6 April

• The International Day of Sport for Development and Peace (IDSDP), which takes place annually on 6 April, presents an opportunity to recognize the positive role sport and physical activity play in communities and in people's lives across the globe. The global theme for 2024 is 'Sport for the Promotion of Peaceful and Inclusive Societies'.

7. International Day of Reflection on the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda | 7 April

• On 7 April, UNESCO commemorates the International Day of Reflection on the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda, which was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2003. The date marks the beginning of the genocide perpetrated against members of the Tutsi minority by the Hutu extremist-led government. The 2024 commemorations will mark the 30th anniversary.

8. World Health Day | 7 April

• <u>World Health Day is observed on 7th April every year globally.</u> This annual event draws attention to a specific health topic that affects people all over the world. <u>This day marks the anniversary of the founding of WHO in 1948.</u>

The theme for World Health Day 2024 is 'My health, my right.'

• The day was aimed to raise awareness around various health issues worldwide and to mobilise support to address them. Over the years, the celebrations have aimed to create awareness around a specific health theme to highlight a priority area of concern for the World Health Organization.

9. World Homoeopathy Day | 10 April

• **Every year on April 10, the world celebrates World Homoeopathy Day**, a day dedicated to honouring the birth anniversary of Dr Samuel Hahnemann, the founder of homoeopathy. This day serves as a platform to raise awareness about homoeopathy, its principles, and its contributions to global healthcare. The theme for World Homeopathy Day is 'Homeoparivar: One Health, One Family.

10. World Parkinson's Day | 11 April

• In 1817, Dr. James Parkinson was the first person to discover the first case of Parkinson's Disease. In 1997, European Association for Parkinson's Disease announced that April 11 will be observed as World Parkinson's Day every year. The World Health Organisation also co-sponsored the event.

• World Parkinson's Disease Day aims to support people with Parkinson's disease and their caregivers, who often face severe difficulties in managing the Parkinson's disease's physical, emotional, and social effects.

11. International Day of Human Space Flight | 12 April

• The International Day of Human Space Flight is celebrated on April 12. The day is

celebrated to honour the first person, Yuri Gagarin, to go to space. The day is also dedicated to the beginning of the space era for mankind, the contribution of space science and technology, and ensuring to conservation of outer space for peaceful purposes.





• On April 7, 2011, the United Nations General Assembly finalised April 12 as the day. On

October 4, 1957, a human-made satellite named, Sputnik I, was sent to space. This was the first ever human effort to explore space. After understanding the technologies, on April 12, 1961, Yuri Gagarin from the Soviet Union became first human to travel around the earth in space. On June 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong became the first person on Earth to set foot on Moon

12. World Chagas Disease Day | 14 April

• <u>World Chagas Disease Day is observed annually on April 14 to increase awareness about</u> <u>this neglected disease.</u> It is considered neglected because it receives little attention on the public health agenda. <u>The World Health Assembly at WHO approved and endorsed on May 2019, with the first</u> <u>celebration held on April 14, 2020. Theme 2024: Early diagnosis, treatment and follow-up</u>.

• Chagas disease, also called American trypanosomiasis, is a communicable parasitic disease that has infected 6-7 million people and claims around 12,000 lives every year across the globe, according to WHO. It is caused by the parasite protozoan Trypanosoma cruzi. The disease is named after physician Carlos Chagas who first detected it in a Brazillian child in 1909.

13. World Quantum Day 2024 | 14 April

• **India celebrates World Quantum Day 2024 on April 14, 2024**, with aspirations to become a global leader in various fields of Quantum Science and Technology.

• Quantum Mechanics, the study of atoms and sub-atomic particles, has now advanced to such an extent that it has now moved to the engineering domain and is leading to novel and varied applications.

• Researchers worldwide have utilized its principles to develop technologies such as LEDs, lasers, and ultra- precise atomic clocks used in the Global Positioning System. Considerable attention is now being paid to controlling and manipulating quantum systems for Quantum Computing, Quantum Communications, and Quantum Sensing applications.

• To advance the awareness and appreciation of quantum science and technology among the public worldwide, an international initiative was taken in 2022, commemorated annually as the World Quantum Day on April 14th. The National Quantum Mission (NQM) received Cabinet approval on April 19, 2023 with a total outlay of Rs 6003.65 Crore for a period of eight years.

14. World Art Day | 15 April

• **World Art Day 2024 is celebrated every year on 15 April**. It is dedicated to the birthday of the famous artist Leonardo da Vinci, who is considered to be the symbol of freedom of expression and peace. The history of World Art Day dates back to 2012, when the International Association of Art held a special ceremony in Guadalajara, Mexico, to celebrate the day.

• The significance of World Art Day is to promote and highlight the importance of art in the lives of human beings. The theme of World Art Day 2024 is 'A GARDEN OF EXPRESSION: Cultivating Community Through Art.'

15. World Hemophilia Day | 17 April

• <u>World Hemophilia Day is a global healthcare event observed on April 17 every year.</u> This event is organised by the World Federation of Hemophilia. This day tries to create awareness about this condition that can help people have access to diagnosis, treatment and comprehensive care. <u>The theme for</u> **2024** is "Equitable access for all: recognizing all bleeding disorders".





16. International Day For Monuments and Sites | 18 April

• World Heritage Day, also monikered as the International Day for Monuments and Sites

(IDMS), is observed on April 18 every year to honor and protect out cultural legacy. The International Council for Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) created <u>World Heritage Day, also referred to as The</u> International Day for Monuments and Sites, in 1982. This year, the theme of World Heritage Day is 'Discover and Experience Diversity'.

17. Chinese Language Day | 20 April

• <u>April 20th marks the Chinese Language Day. Chinese was established as an official</u> <u>language of the United Nations in 1946.</u> It seek to celebrate multilingualism and cultural diversity as well as to promote equal use of all six official languages throughout the Organization.

23. English Language Day | 23 April

1. President Droupadi Murmu To Dedicate CAR-T Cell Therapy To Nation At IIT Bombay

President Droupadi Murmu has recently dedicated CAR-T Cell Therapy to the nation at IIT

Bombay. The CAR-T Cell Therapy (used to treat cancer patients) has been developed in India by IIT Bombay-incubated Company Immunoadoptive Cell Therapy (ImmunoACT). The CAR-T Cell Therapy product has been developed as a collaborative effort between IIT Bombay and Tata Memorial Centre(TMC)

• Designed and developed at IIT Bombay, the therapy has undergone integrative process development and manufacturing at ImmunoACT. Clinical investigations and translational studies were conducted by teams at TMH.

2. Tata's made-in-India military-grade satellite successfully placed in orbit by SpaceX rocket

• <u>Tata Advanced Systems (TASL), Tata Sons' wholly-owned subsidiary, has launched India's</u> <u>first</u> <u>private sector-built sub-metre resolution earth observation satellite, TSAT-1A</u>, in collaboration with Satellogic. The satellite was launched from the Kennedy Space Center, Florida, by SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket.

• TSAT-1A will provide high-resolution satellite images with low-latency delivery. The Indian armed forces are expected to be one of its major users. This is the first sub-metre high-resolution earth observation satellite by the private sector in India. The satellite, weighing less than 50 kg, is in low-earth orbit.

3. GUJCOST designated as Nodal Centre for ISRO's START programme

• <u>The Gujarat Council on Science and Technology (GUJCOST) has been designated as the</u> <u>Nodal</u> <u>Centre for the 'Space Science and Technology Awareness Training (START)' programme by</u> <u>the</u> <u>Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The START programme, a brainchild of ISRO,</u> <u>offers</u> <u>an introductory-level online training platform.</u>

• Encompassing a vast spectrum of space science research areas, including planetary exploration, astronomy, heliophysics, atmospheric science, and microgravity research. This initiative promises to ignite the curiosity of aspiring scientists and engineers. The inaugural online programme is themed 'Exploration of Solar System,'.

4. Meta Unveils Upgraded Meta AI Assistant Powered by Llama 3 AI

Meta announced a major upgrade to its AI assistant, Meta AI, which is powered by the

company's latest natural language model, Llama 3. According to Meta, the updated Meta AI is designed to be helpful, harmless, and honest. It can now be accessed across Meta's platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp, and Messenger, as well as a dedicated website at meta.ai.

• Powered by Meta's state-of-the-art Llama 3 model, Meta AI is designed with new advancements in AI and natural language processing and is available for free use. It can understand language better and have more human-like conversations.

5. Microsoft launches lightweight artificial intelligence model Phi-3-mini

 <u>Microsoft launched a lightweight artificial intelligence model, as it looks to attract a wider</u> <u>client base with cost-effective options. The new version called Phi-3-mini is the first of the three</u> <u>small language models to be released by the company</u>, as it stakes its future on a technology that is expected to have a wide-ranging impact on the world and the way people work.





6. China launches 3 astronauts to Tiangong space station on Shenzhou 18 mission

• <u>A team of three astronauts launched aboard a rocket as part of China's Shenzhou-18</u> <u>mission, heading towards the Tiangong space station in low earth orbit, according to Chinese</u> <u>space authorities.</u>

• This marks the most recent mission in Beijing's space programme, which is working towards sending astronauts to the Moon by 2030.

• The Shenzhou-18 spacecraft, also known as the "Divine vessel," along with its three passengers, launched atop a Long March-2F rocket from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in northwest China.

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Defence

1. India, Maldives & Sri Lanka's 'Dosti-16' held in Maldives

• Seeking to enhance maritime security and interoperability, coast guard personnel from India, the Maldives and Sri Lanka have embarked on a four-day trilateral exercise to identify emerging maritime challenges in the Indian Ocean Region. Indian Coast Guard ship Samarth and ICGS Abhinav took part at the exercise 'DOSTI-16'. Bangladesh is participating as an observer.

2. IAF's Biggest Exercise 'Gagan Shakti' At Pokhran Field Firing Range In Jaisalmer District To Continue Till April 10

• The Indian Air Force is conducting its biggest exercise 'Gagan Shakti' at the Pokhran Field Firing Range in Jaisalmer district. This exercise which began on 3 April, will continue till April

10. In the exercise, all the major fighter aircraft and modern helicopters of the Air Force are demonstrating their striking capabilities.

• The exercise is being conducted at various locations across the country, including the Pokhran Field Firing Range in Jaisalmer. Many fighter planes and helicopters including Tejas, Rafale, Sukhoi 30, Jaguar, Globemaster, Chinook, Apache, and Prachanda will participate in the exercise.

It was last held in 2018, during which the IAF completed over 11,000 sorties during the

two- phase air manoeuvre. The Indian Army is providing logistics support for this mega exercise, facilitating a comprehensive pan-India movement of approximately 10,000 IAF personnel and ammunition in order to validate the Operational Rail Mobilisation Plan aspects of the Indian Air Force

3. New Generation Ballistic Missile Agni-Prime successfully flight-tested by Strategic Forces Command & DRDO off the Odisha coast

• <u>Strategic Forces Command (SFC), along with Defence Research and Development</u> Organisation (DRDO), conducted the successful flight-test of New Generation Ballistic Missile Agni-Prime from Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha on April 03, 2024.

• The test met all the trial objectives validating its reliable performance, as confirmed from the data captured by a number of range sensors deployed at different locations, including two downrange ships placed at the terminal point.

4. Army Medical Corps celebrates 260th Raising Day

• Army Medical Corps celebrated its 260th Raising Day on 03rd April 2024. Raised in the year 1764, the Corps has rendered selfless service to the nation over centuries of progress, development, dedication & sacrifice, both in combat and in peace, living up to the Corps motto of 'Sarve Santu Niramaya' meaning 'let all be free from disease'.

5. Indian Army gets portable Igla-S Air defence system

• <u>The Indian Army has received the first batch of 24 Russia-made Igla-S Man Portable Air</u> <u>Defence Systems (MANPADS), along with 100 missiles, as part of a larger deal that includes</u> <u>domestic production in India.</u> The Igla-S system is being acquired to enhance the Indian Army's Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) capabilities.

• The Igla-S is a hand-held defence system that can be operated by an individual or crew. It is designed to bring down low-flying aircraft and can also identify and neutralise air targets such as cruise missiles and drones. India signed a contract with Russia in November last year for 120 launchers and 400 missiles.





6. Coastal security exercise 'Sagar Kavach' conducted off Lakshadweep Islands

• <u>A two-day exercise involving all maritime security agencies of the country was conducted</u> off the Lakshadweep Islands from April 1-2. During the exercise, validation of the effectiveness of coastal security mechanisms while dealing with asymmetric threats emanating from the sea was undertaken.

• Assets of the Indian Navy, Coast Guard, Marine Police, fisheries, customs and other security agencies were engaged in the coastal security exercise -- Sagar Kavach 01/24. The exercise witnessed enhanced preparedness, response mechanism, surveillance capabilities and coordination between the coastal security stakeholders.

7. India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise DUSTLIK begins on April 15

• <u>The fifth edition of India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise Dustlik will commence at</u> <u>Termez District in Uzbekistan from April 15 onwards.</u> Participating contingents from the Indian Armed Forces and the Armed Forces of the Republic of Uzbekistan will undergo joint training sessions during the exercise.

• The fourth edition of the joint military exercise between the Indian Army and Uzbekistan Army was held on February 20 last year at the Foreign Training Node, Pithoragarh in Uttarakhand. The Indian Army contingent comprises troops from an infantry battalion from the Garhwal Rifles Regiment. The first edition of the exercise was held in Uzbekistan in November 2019.

8. DRDO & Indian Army conduct successful trials of indigenous Man Portable Anti-tank Guided Missile Weapon System

• <u>Man Portable Anti-tank Guided Missile Weapon System, indigenously designed and</u> <u>developed by Defence Research & Development Organisation, has been field evaluated in</u> <u>different flight configurations several times with the objective of proving the technology with</u> <u>superiority.</u> The Warhead Flight Trials were successfully conducted at the Pokhran Field Firing Range, Rajasthan.

9. SPACE, a premier testing & evaluation hub for sonar systems for Indian Navy, set up by DRDO, inaugurated in Kerala

• <u>A state-of-the-art Submersible Platform for Acoustic Characterisation and Evaluation</u> (<u>SPACE</u>) was inaugurated in Idukki, Kerala. The SPACE, set up by the Naval Physical & Oceanographic Laboratory of DRDO, has been designed as a premier testing and evaluation hub for sonar systems destined for Indian Navy onboard various platforms including ships, submarines and helicopters.

• The SPACE marks a milestone in naval technology advancement. It will consist of two distinct assemblages - a platform which floats on the water surface, and a submersible platform which can be lowered to any depth upto 100 m using winch systems. Upon completion of operations, the submersible platform can be winched up and docked with the floating platform.

10. DRDO conducts successful flight test of Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile from Chandipur off Odisha coast

• <u>The Defence Research and Development Organisation conducted a successful flight test of</u> the Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile from the Integrated Test Range, Chandipur, off the <u>coast of Odisha. his successful flight test has also established the reliable performance of the</u> <u>indigenous propulsion system developed by the Gas Turbine Research Establishment (GTRE),</u> <u>Bengaluru.</u>

• The missile is also equipped with advanced avionics and software to ensure better and more reliable performance. The missile is developed by Bengaluru-based DRDO laboratory Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE), along with contributions from other laboratories and Indian



industries.



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11. DRDO hands over first batch of indigenous Leading Edge Actuators & Airbrake Control Module to HAL for LCA Tejas Mk1A

DRDO's Aeronautical Development Agency has handed over the first batch of the

indigenous Leading Edge Actuators and Airbrake Control Module to Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, marking a significant leap towards self-reliance in aeronautical technologies. The HAL, Lucknow has already made preparations for the production of these units for the current 83 LCA Tejas order.

12. Indian Navy Conducted Exercise Poorvi Lehar On East Coast

• **Indian Navy conducted Exercise Poorvi Lehar on the East Coast.** The exercise aimed at validation of procedures towards assessment of the Indian Navy's preparedness to meet Maritime Security challenges in the region. The exercise witnessed participation of Ships, Submarines, aircraft and Special Forces.

• It was conducted in multiple phases including combat training in a realistic scenario during the Tactical Phase and the successful conduct of various firings during the Weapon Phase towards reaffirming the Indian Navy's capability to deliver ordnance on target.

13. India fourth-largest military spender, overall global spending accelerates: SIPRI report

• India was the fourth largest military spender globally in 2023. At \$83.6 billion, the country's military expenditure was 4.2 per cent higher than in 2022. Meanwhile, global military expenditure rose by 7 per cent to \$2,443 billion in 2023, the steepest annual rise since 2009, said the latest report by Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI).

• <u>As per the report, the 10 largest spenders in 2023, led by the United States, China and Russia, all</u> increased their military spending. The largest percentage increase in military spending by any country in 2023 was seen in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (+105 per cent). South Sudan recorded the second largest percentage increase (+78 per cent) amid internal violence.

14. DRDO develops lightest Bullet Proof Jacket of country for protection against highest threat Level of BIS ammunition

• Defence Research and Development Organisation, DRDO has successfully developed the lightest Bullet Proof Jacket in the country for protection against highest threat Level 6 of BIS ammunition. Recently, this bullet proof jacket was successfully tested at TBRL, Chandigarh.

• Ministry of Defence in a statement said, this jacket is based upon new design approach, where novel material along with new processes have been used. It added that the front Hard Armour Panel (HAP) of this jacket defeats multiple hits. The ergonomically designed front HAP is made up of monolithic ceramic plate with polymer backing which enhances the wearability and comfort.

15. IAF successfully tests air-launched ballistic missile in Andamans, significantly boosts standoff capabilities

• <u>The Indian Air Force (IAF) has achieved a significant milestone with the successful test</u> <u>firing of an air-launched ballistic missile capable of hitting targets over 250 kilometers away.</u>

• <u>The missile, known as ROCKS or Crystal Maze 2, is of Israeli origin and was test-fired from a Su-30</u> MKI fighter jet in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

- The Crystal Maze 2 is an extended stand-off range air-to-surface missile designed to strike high-value stationary and relocatable targets, including long-range radars and air defense systems.
- It is specifically effective in GPS-denied environments, similar to the conditions faced by India during





the Kargil War, and can also penetrate areas protected by air defense systems.

- The 37-year-old was also a former top 10 athlete in world squash rankings, reaching the level in April 2019 and staying there for six months. He is also the only Indian man to enter the top 10 in the World rankings. The nine-time Asian Games medallist played a significant role in leading India to gold medals in the teams event at 2014 and 2022 editions of the Asian Games.
- Ghosal has to his name 13 national titles, and three CWG medals.
- He also became the first Indian male player to secure a CWG squash medal in a singles competition at the same event.
- He has also won the World Doubles Championships gold medal after partnering compatriot Dipika Pallikal Karthik in the mixed event at the 2022 Glasgow competition.

Non-life insurers posted a 12.78 per cent year-on-year (Y-o-Y) growth in gross direct premium underwritten in 2023-24 (FY24), reaching Rs 2.89 trillion, compared to 16.4 per cent in the previous financial year.

• Public sector general insurers clocked an 8.99 per cent growth in premium to Rs 90,344.49 crore, whereas their private sector counterparts witnessed a 17.53 per cent increase to Rs 1.55 trillion. Among companies, the industry leader, <u>The New India Assurance Company, saw a 7.4 per</u> cent Y-o-Y growth in premium to Rs 37,035.19 crore.


• Among other major insurers, <u>HDFC Ergo General Insurance's premium increased by 11.61 per cent</u> to Rs 18,567.56 crore, whereas United India Insurance Company's premium surged 12.51 per cent to Rs 19,851.71 crore and The Oriental Insurance's premium rose 17.1 per cent Y-o-Y to Rs 18,285.82 crore in FY24.

4. Irdai removes age limit of 65 yrs for buying health insurance policies

• <u>With a view to widen the market and foster adequate protection from healthcare</u> expenses, insurance regulator IRDAI has removed the age limit of 65 years for individuals buying health insurance policies.

• This marks a significant departure from the conventional constraints that limited individuals in securing comprehensive coverage.

• As per the earlier guidelines, individuals were allowed to purchase a new insurance policy only till the age of 65. However, with the recent amendment, which has been effective from April 1, anyone, regardless of age, is eligible to buy a new health insurance policy.







• There is no limit on AYUSH treatment coverage. Treatments under systems like Ayurveda, Yoga, Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha & Homeopathy will receive coverage up to the sum insured without any cap. The proposed regulation seeks to handle the complaints and claims of senior citizens via a specialised channel, ensuring a more tailored and responsive approach to their requirement.





India & World

1. India renews agreement to export electricity to Nepal for next 3 months

• India renewed the agreement to export electricity to Nepal for the next three months.

 Under the agreement, which was to expire on March 31, <u>Nepal can import a total of 554 MW</u> electricity from India between 6 am and 6 pm. Nepal's domestic electricity production currently stands at around 1,200 MW while the country's demand for electricity is 1,800 MW to 2,000 MW.

2. India to join U.S. led carbon market project under IPEF initiative

• India has decided to join at least one of the four cooperative work programmes launched under the 'clean energy pillar' of the US-led Indo Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) ' the one on facilitating and promoting carbon market activities. The IPEF, an initiative led by US President Joe Biden, was launched in May 2022, bringing together 14 regional partners.

• <u>The 14 countries are Australia, Brunei, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia,</u> <u>New Zealand, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, the US, and Vietnam.</u> PEF aims to have a common set of rules and standards around four pillars: connectivity and digital trade; resilient supply chains; clean energy; and corruption-free fair trade.

3. India secures second overseas port Sittwe in Myanmar after Chabahar in Iran

• After Chabahar in Iran, India has gained the rights to operate a second overseas port, Sittwe, in Myanmar. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has approved a proposal for India Ports Global (IPGL) to take over the operations of the entire port located on the Kaladan River. IPGL is a company 100 per cent owned by the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways.

• Sittwe Port has been developed under a framework agreement between India and Myanmar for the construction and operation of a Multimodal Transit Transport Facility on the Kaladan River, connecting the Sittwe Port in Myanmar with the state of Mizoram in India.

4. India, Mauritius revise tax treaty, aim to plug evasion

India has signed a protocol amending the Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA)
 with Mauritius to plug treaty abuse for tax evasion or avoidance. In the amended protocol, Article
 27B has been introduced in the treaty defining the 'entitlement to benefits'. The amendment to the India-Mauritius treaty was signed on March 7 at Port Louis and was made public recently.

• The amended pact has included what is called the Principal Purpose Test (PPT), which essentially lays out the condition that the tax benefits under the treaty will not be applicable if it is established that obtaining that duty benefit was the principal purpose of any transaction or arrangement.

• Mauritius has been a preferred jurisdiction for investments in India due to the non-taxability of capital gains from the sale of shares in Indian companies until 2016. The treaty was last amended in May 2016 allowing the right to tax capital gains arising from sale or transfer of shares of an Indian company acquired by a Mauritian tax resident.

• The DTAA was a major reason for a large number of foreign portfolio investors (FPI) and foreign entities to route their investments in India through Mauritius. Mauritius remains India's fourth largest source of FPI investments, after the US, Singapore, and Luxembourg.

• A Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) is a pact signed by two nations that encourages capital investment, trade in goods and services, and other economic activities between the two nations





by preventing International Double Taxation.

5. India, US to reactivate observation system for Indian Ocean

• India and the US have decided to reactivate the Indian Ocean Observing System, a network of 36 moored buoys in the high seas to collect high-resolution ocean and atmospheric data for weather forecasts. The moored buoys are part of the Research Moored Array for African-Asian-Australian

weather forecasts. The moored buoys are part of the Research Moored Array for African-Asian-Australian Monsoon Analysis and Prediction program.

It was born out of a collaboration between the Ministry of Earth Sciences and NOAA in 2008. The RAMA
moored buoys also provide important verification data for air-sea flux products and satellite
measurements.

6. India delivers 1st batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles to Philippines

• India delivered the first batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles and launchers to the Philippines, two years after the two countries signed a deal worth almost \$375 million to equip the Philippine Marines with three batteries of the missiles. This is the first export order for the BrahMos missile developed by India and Russia.

India has set a defence export target of Rs. 35,000 crore by 2024-25. The BrahMos

supersonic cruise missile has a two-stage solid propellant booster engine as its first stage which takes it to supersonic speed. The second stage is the liquid ramjet engine which takes it closer to Mach 3 (3 times the speed of sound) speed in the cruise phase. The Indian Army has integrated multiple BrahMos regiments into its arsenal since 2007.





Apps & Portals

1. SEBI Launches New & More User-Friendly Version Of Complaint Redress System ' SCORES 2.0.

• <u>The Securities and Exchange Board of India ' SEBI has launched a new and more</u> <u>user-friendly version of its complaint redress system ' SCORES 2.0. According to SEBI, the</u> <u>timeline for redressal of complaints in SCORES 2.0 has been reduced to 21 calendar days.</u>

• Besides, there will be two levels of review, first by the 'Designated Body' and if the investor is dissatisfied, SEBI will undertake a second review. The market regulator has enabled integration with the KYC Registration Agency database for easy registration of the investor on SCORES.

2. Tata AIA unveils payment solution system on WhatsApp

• <u>Tata AIA Life Insurance Co. Ltd. (Tata AIA) has unveiled a premium payment service via</u> <u>WhatsApp, making it the first type in the industry.</u> Previously limited to UPI-based transactions, Tata AIA customers can now use a variety of payment options on WhatsApp. Policyholders can now conveniently make renewal payments via WhatsApp using credit card, debit card, or net banking.

Policyholders can now pay up to INR 1 crore premiums instead of the previous limit of INR

• The myCGHS iOS app is developed by the technical teams of the National Informatics Centre (NIC) Himachal Pradesh and NIC Health Team. It is a convenient mobile application offering features aimed at enhancing information and accessibility for CGHS beneficiaries. The app features security features like 2-factor authentication and functionality of mPIN.

1. ABFRL to demerge Madura Fashion & Lifestyle into separate listed entity

• <u>The board of directors of Aditya Birla Fashion and Retail (ABFRL) authorised the</u> <u>management of the company to evaluate the vertical demerger of the Madura Fashion & Lifestyle</u> (MFL) business from ABFRL into a separate, listed company.

• The MFL business consists of four lifestyle brands: **Louis Philippe, Van Heusen, Allen Solly and Peter England.** These, along with casual wear brands American Eagle & Forever 21, sportwear brand Reebok, and the innerwear business under Van Heusen, will be demerged into a separate listed entity.

2. Fincare merges with AU Small Finance Bank

Madhya Pradesh
